WASHINGTON LETTER.

(From Our Regular Correspondent.)
WASHINGTON, December 8th, 1902.
Following its usual custom, Congress will take its time until after the holidays, notwithstanding the large amount of business which demands consideration and the shortness of the current session. This fact is proven by the adjournment of the Senate from Friday until today, after having adjourned over Thursday, and by the lack of energy displayed on the House floor. Much work is being done in committee, however, and after the Christmas recess legislative discussion will be sharp and active.

The report of the Senate Committee on Territories, which recommended the admission to statehood of Oklahoma, to the exclusion of Arizona and New Mexico, was a severe disappointment to the friends of the aspirants to statehood and promises to result in a sharp fight on the floor of the Senate. Senator Quay still speaks hopefully of the future of the bill as passed by the House and there is a rumor that he will endeavor to force his views by attempting to precipitate a tariff fight if the three territories are not admitted. When seen by your correspondent, however, he would neither deny nor affirm the statement but said freely that he would regard it as a grave error of statesmanship if the republicans made themselves responsible for the defeat of the measure.

The New England senators are practically unanimous in their opposition to the admission of Arizona and New Mexico and some of them favor the admission of Oklahoma with Indian Territory added thereto, a move which in the opinion of many, would insure the new state's electing a Democratic senator. It is, under the rules of the Senate, so easy to talk a bill to death that the prospects of the passage of the Territorial bill are not nearly as bright as they were a short time ago.

In the House, no important legislation has taken place unless the appropriation of \$50,000 for the expenses of the Anthracite Coal Strike Commission be so regarded. The greatest activity prevails in the Judiciary commission, however, where all measures looking to antitrust legislation are being considered. As was to have been expected, Representative Littlefield of Maine is taking the lead in this respect and looks to have his bill reported favorably before the holiday recess. The sub-committee, to which the bill was first referred, has already reported it favorably. This bill provides that every corporation or similar institution doing an interstate business shall, through the Interstate Commerce Commission, make public the details of its financial standing; and imposes a tax of 1 per cent a year on all capital stock outstanding and not fully paid, in cash or its equivalent. The bill applies only to institutions with a capital stock in excess of \$50,000 and is on the Attorney General's list of legislation to be considered. In such cases of violation a law is brought to his attention through the Interstate Commerce Commission.

Another measure which, before the Judiciary Committee is Representative Hepburn's bill appropriating \$500,000 for the use of the Attorney General in enforcing the law against the trusts. In the committee, the democrats and republicans are working together and so far there has been no evidence of party bias. It is true that some of the democrats do not believe that the Senate will pass the measure and regard it as good politics to place the responsibility on the republican minority in the upper chamber, but for the present there is every evidence of sincerity on both sides in

the effort to frame a bill in accordance with the President's recommendations.

Representative Richardson, democratic leader in the House, assures your correspondent that the democrats will support any reasonable anti-trust measure reported by the committee. Many republican senators who are regarded as leaders have expressed the conviction that there would be anti-trust legislation this session, among them Senators Frye, Allison, Lodge, Proctor and Dryden. The only dissenting voice has been that of Senator Hanna who still adheres to his slogan "Stand pat." The Ohio Senator says that he fears the effect on the business of the country of any legislation looking to the regulation of the trusts, but so far he has been the only republican frank enough to so express himself, even if there are others who share his views.



The prospects for a treaty with Cuba are now regarded as excellent by the administration. General Bliss appears to be in high favor in Havana and his reports to the State Department indicate that he is meeting with much success. President Palma has signified his intention of submitting the new treaty only to the Cuban Senate for ratification. Subsequently, a tariff bill will be sent to the Cuban House with the request that it make the changes outlined sometime ago in these letters. It is expected that President Palma will very soon authorize the signing of the treaty and Mr. Roosevelt will immediately send it to the Senate for ratification here. In the meantime, the President has quietly secured the pledges of a number of senators who opposed the bill last session, among them Senators Elihu Root and Charles McNary, who acted as leader for the opposition.

The situation involving the treaty with Colombia, on which hangs the future of the Panama Canal, has undergone a favorable change and the officials of the State Department are much encouraged. Secretary Hay, while loath to express himself too sanguinely, regards the situation with great satisfaction. The appointment of Dr. Herran as Colombian Minister in Washington well, it is believed, make for the immediate settlement of the remaining differences.

Vice Governor Luke E. Wright, who has recently returned from the Philippines, says that with a gold standard dollar and a reduction of the tariff on Philippine imports the islands will experience the utmost prosperity. Senator Lodge has already introduced a bill reducing the tariff from 75 to 25 per cent on Philippine exports and is expected to introduce a measure providing for the gold standard in the islands as soon as is practicable.

At Lissart, in Cheahere, England, is a room that contains hundreds of picture frames made of every imaginable substance, from leather to tigers' bones, one frame being placed within another, according to size, so that the whole surface is covered with frames.

At the recent international conference on tuberculosis at Berlin Dr. Oberstuchen advised that patients suffering from consumption ought to receive sanatorium treatment and permission to return to duty ought to be withheld till all danger of infection had passed away; they should receive their salaries during their illness.

Near Boulogne, there is a mountain inhabited by hundreds of monkeys and thousands of rats. A cyclone raged on the other day; the monkeys were able to cling to the trees, but the rats were carried to the town to the great alarm of the superstitious inhabitants, who regarded them as punishment from above.

More than a century ago the fear of being buried alive led to the establishment in German cities of mortuary chambers, in which a bellows is placed in the hands of each corpse. In his recent work on "Death and Sudden Death," Prof. Brondard declares that there is no case on record of that bell having ever been rung anywhere.

A picture postcard made in Holland has upon the picture a representation of three babies in a cot. In the thickness of the card is inserted a little bag, which, on being pressed, emits the familiar squeak of the crying doll. The legend over the picture of the cot is: "Press me twice, I cry mamma." The idea is ingenious and cleverly worked out.

The old-fashioned way of deciding a question by tossing up a coin is now superseded in England by a clean pastime which is known as "tapnose." Two cabbies have the credit of making the new game public. Instead of tossing for dollars and cents to work to spare the man who first got in a tap on his opponent's nose being the winner and having his drink paid for by the loser.

The forestry work of the country is gradually growing in importance. Twenty-five thousand catalpa trees are to be planted in Southern Illinois by the International Society of Arboriculture. The trees are to be grown for the purpose of supplying crossings and the society has a contract with 20 different railroads to plant small orchards. An orchard has been established near Duquoin, Ill., which will be for the use of the Illinois Central railroad.

A new idea for heat distribution is being tried in the east. Instead of distributing hot water or steam to radiators throughout the building, or employing galvanized iron piping to distribute heated air through columns in the building are utilized for this purpose. These are made hollow, and connected at the base with huge fans, which blow heated air through them. Openings in the columns on each floor provide for a proper circulation.

Submarine cable laying has reached a high state of perfection, as it shown in the preparations completed for the laying of the American Trans-Pacific cable from San Francisco to the Philippines, 8,000 miles, touching at Hawaii and the Caroline Islands, or twice the length of any cable now laid. The cable will be 2 1/2 inches in diameter, deep. Twelve thousand tons of steel wire were used in its construction; 4,200 tons of hemp and tar; 2,300 tons of jute; 1,900 tons copper and 1,200 tons gutta serena.

The question is often asked, "Where do seabirds obtain fresh water to slake their thirst?" An old shipmate conversing on the subject said that he had seen birds at sea, far from any land that could furnish them water, hovering around and under a storm cloud, clattering like ducks on a hot day at a pond, and drinking in the drops of rain as they fell. They will swim a rain equal one hundred miles or even farther off. How long sea-birds can exist without water is only a matter of conjecture.

A large delegation of farmers under the auspices of the German Agricultural Society is coming to the United States in April for a three months tour studying American agricultural methods. The German Agricultural Society, though a private organization, has taken the United States agricultural department as a model, and is trying to do in Germany many things which the department does in the United States. The society has just completed an immense building here costing over \$250,000, in which will be installed the new bureau.

According to an Indian legend, the buzzard used to have a tin topknot, of which he was so proud that he refused to eat carrion, and while the other birds were pecking at the body of a fowl or other matter which they had found he would strut around and say: "You may have it all; it is not good enough for me." They resolved to punish him, and with the help of the buffalo carried off his tin topknot, which the buzzard lost not his topknot alone, but nearly all the other feathers on his head. He lost his pride at the same time.

DEATH OF THOMAS B. REED

Ex-Speaker of the National House Passes Away in Washington After a Brief Illness.

DRAMAIC POISONING WAS THE CAUSE.

His Wife and Daughter at the Bed-side When the Fatal Poison—Homocaine—Taken in Portland, Me., for Burial—Epitome of the Career of the Dead Statesman.

Washington, Dec. 8.—Ex-Speaker Thomas B. Reed died at ten minutes after midnight Sunday morning. At 12 o'clock word came from Mr. Reed's room direct from Dr. Gardner, the family physician, that Mr. Reed was dying. A complete condition of uraemia had set in which it was impossible to relieve. Dr. Gooden, an eminent specialist in uraemic diseases, arrived from Philadelphia shortly before 11 o'clock and extreme measures were advised by him to carry the patient through the crisis. These were at once used, but without avail.

These were in his bedside Mrs. Reed, her daughter Katherine, Dr. W. C. Gooden, of Philadelphia, and Drs. Gardner and MacDonall, of this city.

A large number of Mr. Reed's friends were in the lobby of the hotel anxiously awaiting for news from his bedside.

Many Sympathetic Callers.

During the entire day there was a stream of sympathetic callers at the Arlington hotel, where the body of Mr. Reed lay waiting removal to the railroad station. They included President and Mrs. Roosevelt, members of the cabinet and of the senate and house representatives and of the diplomatic corps. Many persons in private life also called. Neither Mrs. Reed nor her daughter saw any of the visitors, who simply left their cards.

Sorrow in Portland.

Portland, Me., Dec. 8.—The news of the death of Thomas B. Reed was received here with unfeigned sorrow. Mr. Reed was born in Portland, was educated in the schools of this city and there was always his home, as he retained his residence in Portland after he resigned his seat in congress to enter upon the practice of law in New York. He was personally known to a great number of the people of the city and there are scores of friends here who have been his lifelong friends.

Body Arrives in Portland.

Portland, Me., Dec. 8.—The body of Thomas Brackett Reed, former speaker of the house of representatives, is now in Portland, the birthplace and for the greater part of his life the residence of Mr. Reed. The train bearing the remains here shortly after 11 o'clock Monday.

LONG IN PUBLIC LIFE.

Career of Mr. Reed Began in Maine Many Years Ago.

Thomas Brackett Reed was born October 18, 1839, in Portland, Me. For almost 40 years he was prominent in the affairs of his state or the nation. He began public life as a paymaster in the navy during the civil war. Later he served his state in the legislature and as an attorney general. When he was elected to congress in 1876 he began the first of 12 terms in that body. He retired from public life in 1899 and resumed the practice of law in New York city.
