GOV. JOHNSON PASSED AWAY.

Dies In Hospital At Rochester, Tuesda Morning, At 3:25 O'clock.

Governor John A. Johnson, the 16th governor of the bread and butter state, passed away at St. Mary's Hospital, Rochester, Tuesday morning at 3:25, after an operation performed by the doctors Mayo, September 14, at 8:29 p. m.//The the doctors Mayo, September 14, at 8:29 p. m.//The operation was very difficult and death was caused by exhaustion. This was the fourth operation the governor had undergone in ten years, the first being for appendicitis.

From the first, as soon as it was learned that the governor must undergo an operation, grave fears for the successful accomplish

as it was leathed that an operation, grave fears for it's successful accomplishment were entertained by the entire populace of the state and the bulletins announcing his condition were looked for with grave apprehension, and when it was reported that he was on the gain, the whole state rejoiced, only to be plunged into gloom when the next one was issued stating he was much worse. Thus it was until the final summons came as reported a bove.

The funeral was held from his old home at St. Peter, where he had been interested in the news-paper business for a number of years. The body of the governor, under military escort, was brot to St. Paul on a special train at 5:30 p. m. Wednesday and laid in state until Thursday morning, at the capitol when it was taken to St. Peter for interrment.

Governor Johnson was three times elected to the highest office in the state and was beloved for the straight-forward manner ir which he carried on his campaigns, by both political parties and his opponents, in all their campaigns have had nothing to say for him but praises, after the smoke of the battle o ballots had rolled away.


