DRYS ARE DEFEATED IN OHIO

G. O. P. Makes Gain, Electing Governor of Massachusetts and Mayor of Philadelphia and Cleveland—But Defeated.

New York, Nov. 4.—Woman suffrage was defeated decisively in all three states where the question was an issue in Tuesday's elections.

Massachusetts.—The vote ran very nearly two to one against woman suffrage in this state.

New Jersey, the president's home state, increased the Republican majority in the legislature by electing two state senators.

State-wide prohibition was defeated in Ohio by 7,000 majority. Cleveland elected a Republican mayor by 6,000 majority.
