Mr. Rines has been in public life many years and has a legislative record which has won him many friends throughout the state. He has stood squarely for the interests of the people. He was county auditor of Kanabec county for ten years, after which he served eight years in the legislature, being Speaker of the House in the 1913 session and made an unusual record as an efficient and economical public official. 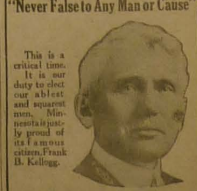

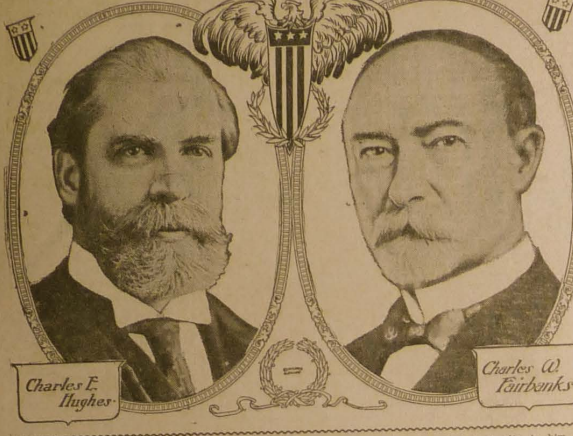

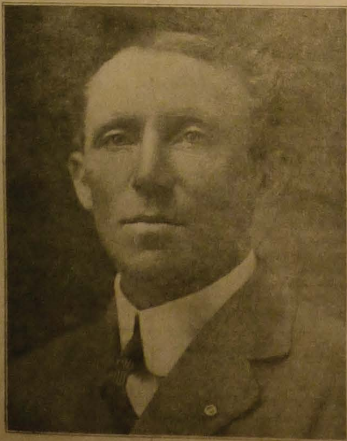

**EBERHART OR LINDBERGH?**

Present indications seem to be that either Eberhart or Lindbergh will be nominated for U. S. senator by the Republicans at the primaries, next Monday. Eberhart is a Republican but Lindbergh, while calling himself a Republican, has always found his strongest supporters among the radical Democrats and Socialists. Eberhart is not strong on promises, but once he makes a promise, he never fails to keep it, while Lindbergh, both in his literature and his speeches, is given to promising everything under the sun—whether he can or will "make good" our readers are as able to judge as we are.

The Kellogg campaign is making an awful noise but general impression is that it isn't getting very far with the voters. The fact that most all the rich men and all the big interests of the state are for him, isn't getting him any friends among the common people. No one questions his ability nor integrity but there is a strong feeling that after a life time as a lawyer in the employ of the corporations, he would be pretty liable to think along the same lines in the United States senate, just the same as a Jersey cow is a butter-fat producer but never shows up on the scales, no matter how much she is fed. Then, too, the fact that Mr. Kellogg "busted" the Standard Oil trust and left it in condition to run gasoline up to 25c per gallon is having its effect with some. Anyway, one doesn't find but mighty little Kellogg sentiment among the common people, who have the votes, up this way. Still, they respect and admire him for his mental ability.

Senator Clapp seems to be all out of touch with Republicans in all directions on questions of statesmanship. There is a strong feeling that Knute Nelson ought to be kicked out of the senate or Clapp retired as they never agree on vital matters. But Moses has lots of warm friends who swear at him because of his politics and for him because of his personality and who will vote for him just the same. But things we see and hear make us size it up as "Eberhart or Lindbergh," depending on whether the people want a radical promise or a progressive doer down at Washington.

In order that our readers may have a clear understanding of what Mr. Lindbergh is, we clip from the Congressional Record the first paragraph of a speech that he delivered in the House of Representatives on Saturday, April 8, 1916. He said, "Mr. Speaker, think of it! Two per cent of the people own 60 per cent of all the wealth, while 98 per cent of the people own only 40 per cent. Plutocracy has plundered the Nation. The toilers do all the work that creates the wealth, but the schemers get it. The majority of us are slaves to the "system" and get only a bare subsistence."

As we said above, the fight looks to us like Eberhart or Lindbergh. Kellogg's campaign is killing his chances because it is showing the wealth and power and silk stockings behind him.

With Halvor Steenerson in congress, his brother Elias now wants to be state Railways and Warehouse Commissioner but the people are surely going to turn him down and re-elect Judge Mills who has been on the commission since it was appointed by Governor Knute Nelson, and who has been a strong factor in making that body a beneficial one. When Kansas and Nebraska wheat producers recently tried, in congress, to knock out Minnesota grain inspection, Congressman Steenerson went to sleep and forgot that the people of his district and state would be affected. Maybe, if enough Elias Steenersons were on the Railroad and Warehouse commission, it would go to sleep too. Minnesota grain inspection stands at the head of the list in European markets, and Minnesota should be free to give it up for something

that hasn't been proven of equal or better worth. Judge Mills, as a member of the Railroad and Warehouse commission, has fought to safeguard Minnesota grain inspection and the state needs him where he is. With one Steenerson asleep on the job in congress we have enough of that family.

Leonard Machart has purchased the Brook Park Banner from Howard Folson. He has handled the paper there since it was started last September and has given excellent satisfaction, both to its patrons and owner. He is the youngest editor in this part of the state but he is a hustler. He is giving Brook Park a good paper and we feel that place is to be congratulated on having so reliable a young man represent it in the newspaper field.

Editor Warren of the Hinckley Enterprise, who was one of the first signers of the petition that got Mr. Kellogg into the U. S. senatorial race, and who is handling the Kellogg campaign in this county, says that his man will run strong at Hinckley and Sandstone. Lindbergh is also strong in that part of the county which has quite a large Socialist vote.

There doesn't seem to be a bit of doubt about Henry Rines' nomination for state treasurer by the Republicans at the primary election next Monday, but his friends must bear in mind that he has strong opposition and every man get out to vote for him.

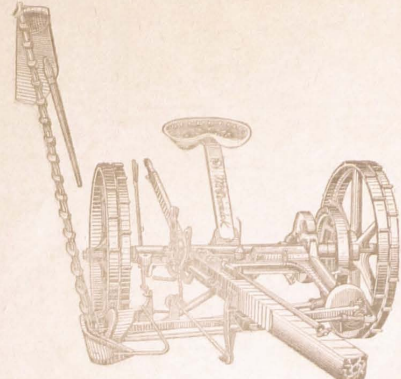
**Films Did Not Arrive on Time.**

SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT HAPPENINGS IN FAR OFF NORTHLAND

ITEMS FROM THE OLD HOME

Resume of the Most Important Events of Interest to the Scandinavians in America.

Denmark.

A Norwegian artist named Lohmus, who has spent several years in painting the interior of the Viborg cathedral, has just been selected to finish a difficult piece of work. Vilhelm Strand, the greatest artist of Denmark, died the noblest death of the artist, the Bank building. He chose as his subject the parable about the talents, but he was not able to finish the work. For a period of half the painting has remained as by itself. It is the officials of the bank they are having a found a man capable of finishing the work, namely, Mr. Lohmus.

A young man, William Christensen, of Flade did not survive the earthquake. He was the last of seven brothers and sisters who all died of tuberculosis. His mother died of the same ailment a number of years ago, and his father, who has followed his wife and seven children to the grave, is bed with the dread disease which took them all away from him.

While some men were removing gravel in a field at Vestergaard, near Haldor, one of them suddenly dropped into the ground up to his armpits. The hole was found to be an ancient tomb. Such tombs are generally covered with a large stone slab, but in this case there were several small ones, which caused the cave-in. Some say, which are about two thousand years old, could not stand the heavy treatment. They were all broken save one, which was not even touched. Experts feel sure there are other tombs of a similar character in the vicinity.

SWEDEN.

Two different railway trains ran in to Stockholm on the same night, and the two were killed. This was the most shocking railway accident recorded in Swedish railway history. The deer were all time.

WHAT'S GOING IN OLD HOME

Summary of the Most Important Happenings in the Land of the Kaiser—Timely Items for the German Readers.

Before the war there were in Rhenland and Westfalen 277 factories employing altogether 14,150 women. On the first of August, 1915, there were 29 factories and 42,750 women employees. Out of 33 factory districts there were only two in which no women were working. In factories engaged in supplying the needs of the armies the number of women employees increased from 1,000 to 1,000. Women everywhere are found performing the most severe physical labor, where they must perform their duties under the most terrible accidents. That they have become proficient seems apparent from the fact that only 47 cases of women being injured at work were recorded throughout 1915. Seventy-five per cent of the women work ten hours a day and a half to eighteen cents an hour. Most employers refuse to recognize the fact that women are doing the work. The question was raised in 277 factories and only 105 of the employers yielded and agreed to the same work rates as the men. In all other works the women receive from 40 to 80 per cent of the rate of pay given to the men.

In the name of the Berlin Artists' association, Professor Schutte, who has been appointed by the government to regulate the "war profits tax," has protested vigorously against the ruling that the "war profits tax" shall apply to the sale of more than \$250 accruing from paintings. The whole tendency of such a ruling, Professor Schutte contends, is to depress automatically the prices of works of art to a point below \$50, and thus work injustice and injury to the families of men who have died recently and who are dependent upon the returns from their paintings.
