# WILSON SAYS WAR TO END THIS YEAR

ASSENTS CRISIS HAS COME AND URGES FARMERS TO RAISE BIG CROPS.

ADDRESS READ AT URBANA

President Seth Forth News of Staff Sacrifice in Record Production—Tells Ruralists to Boost Production—Must Be Passed.

Washington, Feb. 1.—The country is in a state of crisis, and the war must be ended this year, President Wilson declared in a message to Congress today. He urged farmers to raise big crops, and to support the war effort.

# TO FIGHT FARMERS IN SECOND CLASS

WOULD BE FURLOUGHED

Topeka, Kan., Feb. 1.—According to a letter received by Governor Capper from President Wilson it is the hope of the president that the administration will order that farmers may be given deferment in the draft and that through means be granted at planting and harvest seasons to those already in service.

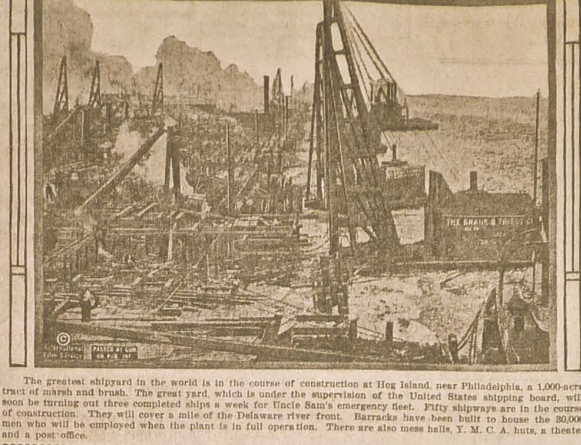
