GOOD THINGS IN SEASON.

BESTNETS may be served in sick, a variety of dishes, that those who are fortunate enough to have plenty may serve many variety dishes. Boiled and served as an scalloped dish, they will nicely take the place of meat as a cream soup, or nut loaf or in Nesselrode pudding they are the nut part of the feast.

Chestnut Soup—Cook two cups of chestnut and blanched chestnuts in chicken stock until tender. Press through a sieve and add a couple of half cups of cream. Nesselrode Pudding—Make a custard of three cups of milk, one of sugar, five eggs, strain, cool and add a pint of thin cream, a fourth of a cup of pineapple syrup and one of orange half cups of prepared chestnuts, then freeze. To prepare the chestnuts, shell, cook, remove brown, wash and force through a strainer. Line a two-quart melon mold with part of the mixture and to the remainder add half a cup of cream, one of orange, one of pineapple and eight chestnuts broken in places and soaked several hours in maraschino juice. Fill the mold, cover, pack in salt and ice and stand several hours to ripen. Serve unmolded on a platter garnished with a hipped cream sweetened and flavored with maraschino syrup.

Chestnut Pie—Prepare a crust for a pie full of the crust and grate finely chopped chestnuts over the top before putting in the oven.

Chocolate Nut Pudding—Mix a cup of soft bread crumbs with two cups of scalded milk, one cup of chopped chestnuts, a half teaspoon of salt, two eggs, yolk of one, one square of chocolate grated, then fold in the beaten whites of two eggs and bake in small molds 20 to 30 minutes.

PREPARE FOR WINTER.

In my intimate companionship with Muir in Alaska I saw many instances of his warm human sympathy. So Hall Young writes in World Outlook. One occurred when in 1879 we were visiting the tribe of Chilkats. These Chilkats, recognized as the most warlike and arrogant of the Tlingit tribes, were nevertheless so interested in the story of the Chilkat that they crowded the house where we lodged, filling it full and trying to pluck from its side so that those without could hear.

The first night we spent in the village, after an all-day's play, we were about to retire to our blankets when a woman brought a baby to us which was almost a skeleton for lack of nourishment, and whose feeble cry was most pitiful to hear. The woman explained that the baby's mother had died, and that they had no food for the infant in connection to nurse it. At once Muir and I set about preparing a medicine for the baby. We diluted it with warm water and thought it of the starving baby. The child was almost dead when we were about to leave for the city. It required the utmost patience and care to feed it. Muir worked with the little pupoose almost all night, rocking it in his arms and soothing its cries, and when at last it rested in a healthy, refreshing sleep, he carried it to the woman who had nursed it, and told her to nurse the child.
