COLD WEATHER HELP FOR STARTING AUTO

Skilled Mechanic With Knowledge of Rules and Customs of Road Is Great Need

Device Made From Thin Piece of Sheet Copper Is Attached to Motor by Clamp—Small Amount of Gasoline Needed.

This heater, made from a piece of one-sixteenth-inch sheet copper, cut and bent as shown, and permanently attached to the motor by the clamp, will heat the intake manifold and gasoline pipes, gear far toward freezing the car from cold-weather starting troubles. A squirt-can of gasoline is conveniently placed under the engine hood, and if the car has been standing long enough to become cold about two teaspoonsful of gasoline are shot into each trough.
