

Plenty of Building---What It Would Do for Business---How it Would Work

what would help local business most at this time? Half the business men if asked this question would answer: Plenty of building. In a hundred cities of the United States the answer would be the same.

Of course, there is more building from month to month. But the expansion grows a few million every year in the United States and for five years building has lagged far behind the needs of increasing families and business enterprises and 2,600,000 Builders.

No doubt many married couples with children and professionals would be helped by more home building and office building and by lower rents. But how would general business be helped?

Well, here in brief is the answer:

In ordinary times about 2,600,000 workmen get their living wage, the money spent at their retail stores by their families and the nation's building industry about 200,000 contractors and their profits and the 125,000 professional men—architects, engineers, etc.—get their commissions and fees. When the industry is half idle, half of these 2,600,000 do not get the money and so they do not spend it. That is plain. Any greater number of dry goods may figure out but long ago it was figured out this plain proposition, it is only about half the story.

Another Army of Workers

Back of this great army of builders is another army, and when this army is only half employed and half paid, the other army is diminished to half time and half pay.

When the 2,600,000 builders are less, some other 2,500,000 other men are kept at work to supply them with materials. These lumber and office builders, the makers of homes and offices in cities reach back and purchase in their enterprises the products of 450,000 steel workers, for in-

Nine-Cent Knife Brings Five Dollars in Chicago

U. S. MANUFACTURERS LOSE CUSTOMERS
AND U. S. WORKMEN LOSE THEIR JOBS
BUT THE CONSUMER PAYS PROFITEERS

CHAIRMAN FORDNEY, of the Ways and Means Committee of the United States House of Representatives, exhibited the knives photographed above to Congress. One cost nine cents in Germany; the other five dollars in Chicago.

A few days ago a Chicago importing firm stated that the knife No. 2 had been twice the price in Chicago than it was in America. The last time it was imported nine cents and that it was bought in America. The Chicago firm bought the knives, which were imported by J. A. Henckels' Chicago firm, from the American Knives Co., of that city.

The American Knives Co. is Germany, from the American Knives Co. according to their own testimony giving the Chicago firm a profit of more than 100 per cent, but the German importer in New York paid it for nine sixteenth-cents in Germany and sold it for \$2.40.

He bought it for \$2.30 in the deal. The consumer, according to Mr. Fordney, paid the sum of \$2.30 for the deal.

Testimony before the U. S. Senate and House of Representatives shows that Paris hats, which cost 40 cents in America, are being sold here for \$20, fine steel buttons, costing 24 cents here, were being sold for \$20 per dozen. This is possible under the present duties being levied for 22.50 per cent.

This is possible under the present tariff law provided that imported articles are subject to duty on their value in foreign money.

But the American money has dropped far below par so that the public is losing millions of dollars per day in revenue and the public is paying profiteering prices.

Chairman Fordney declared that the remedy is in the tariff bill now before the U. S. Senate, which provides that imported articles shall pay duty

on their value in our country. This is called "American valuation."

Supporters of this bill say that importers and small order houses are spending

more than one million dollars to defeat it because it means death to their

large order houses.

These adherents of American valuation also point out that never has

such a fight been waged in Washington against a bill as in Congress as is

now being waged against the Fordney tariff bill.


