Members of this group may be in grades nine through twelve and are coached by Mrs. Rust. All those who survive local eliminations receive their well-deserved awards in the spring.

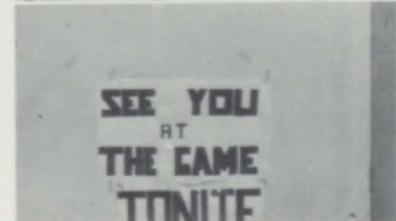
