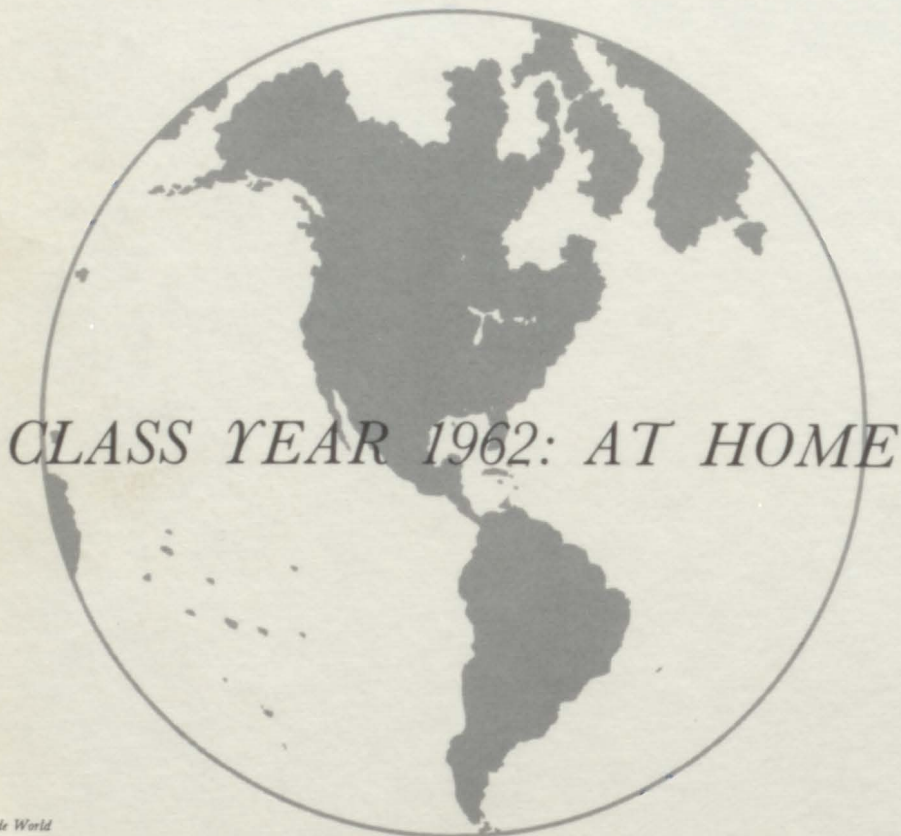

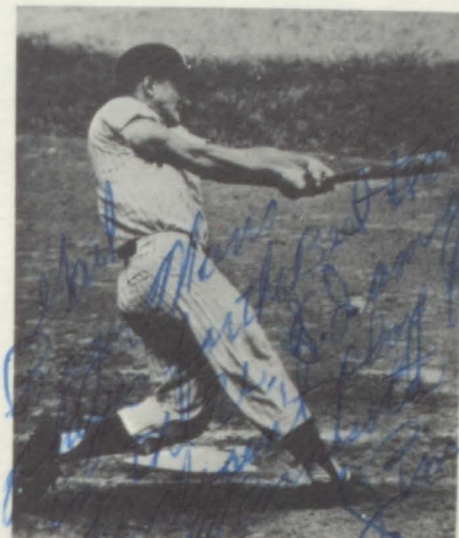

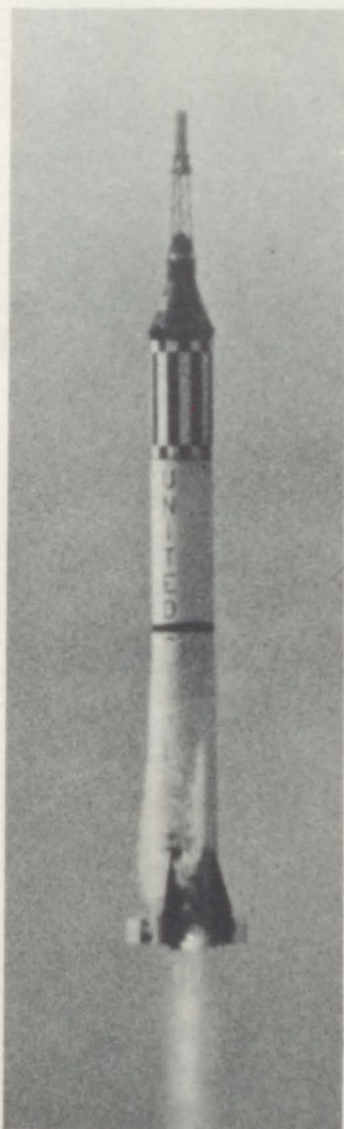

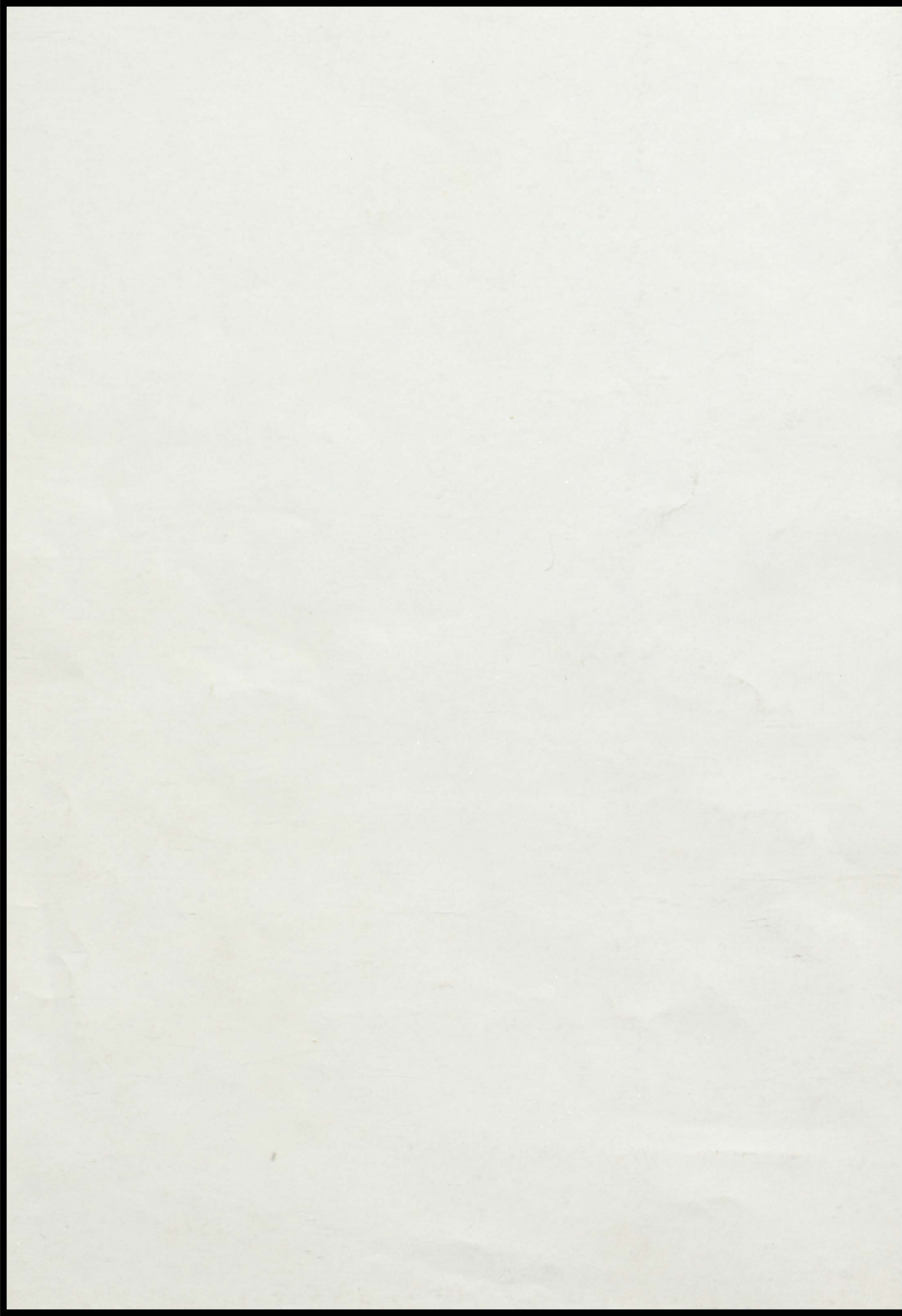

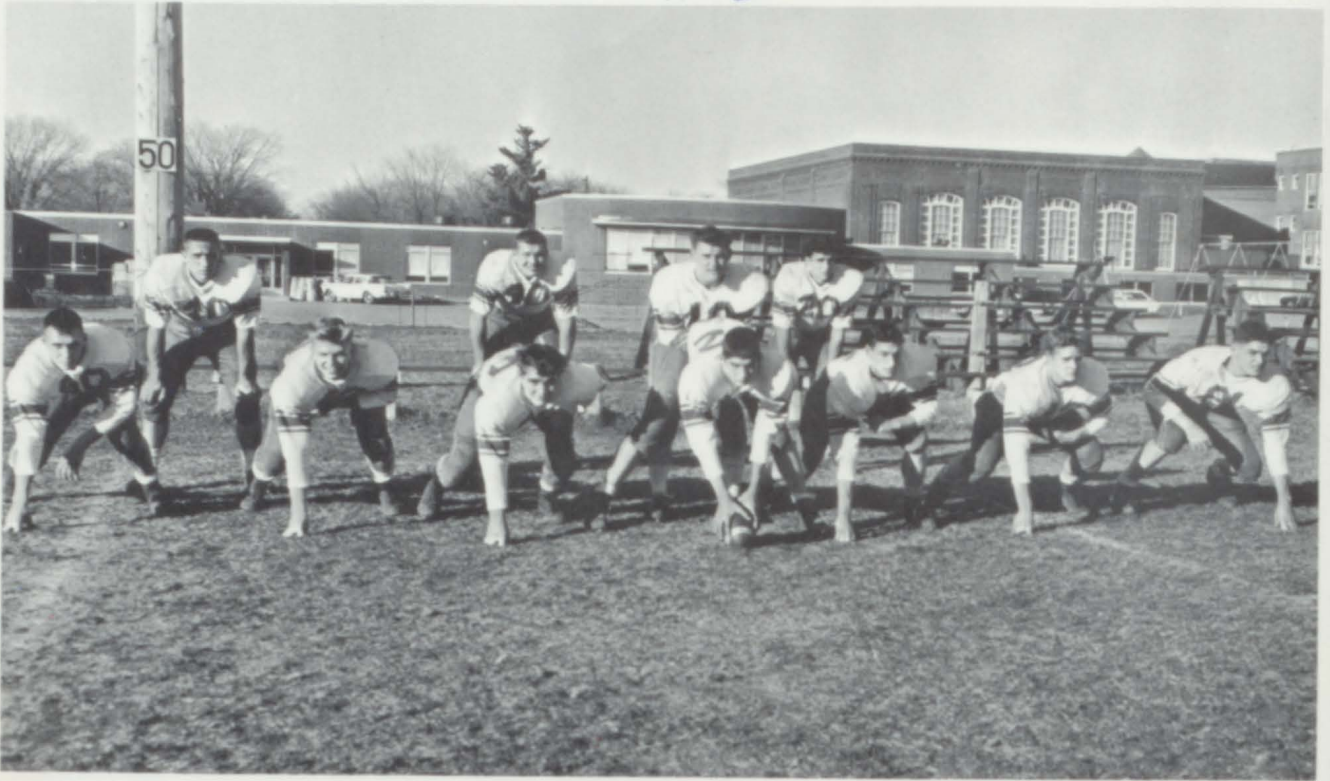
In the final game, the Dragons Stayed undefeated outlasting a stubborn Lindstrom team 28-13.

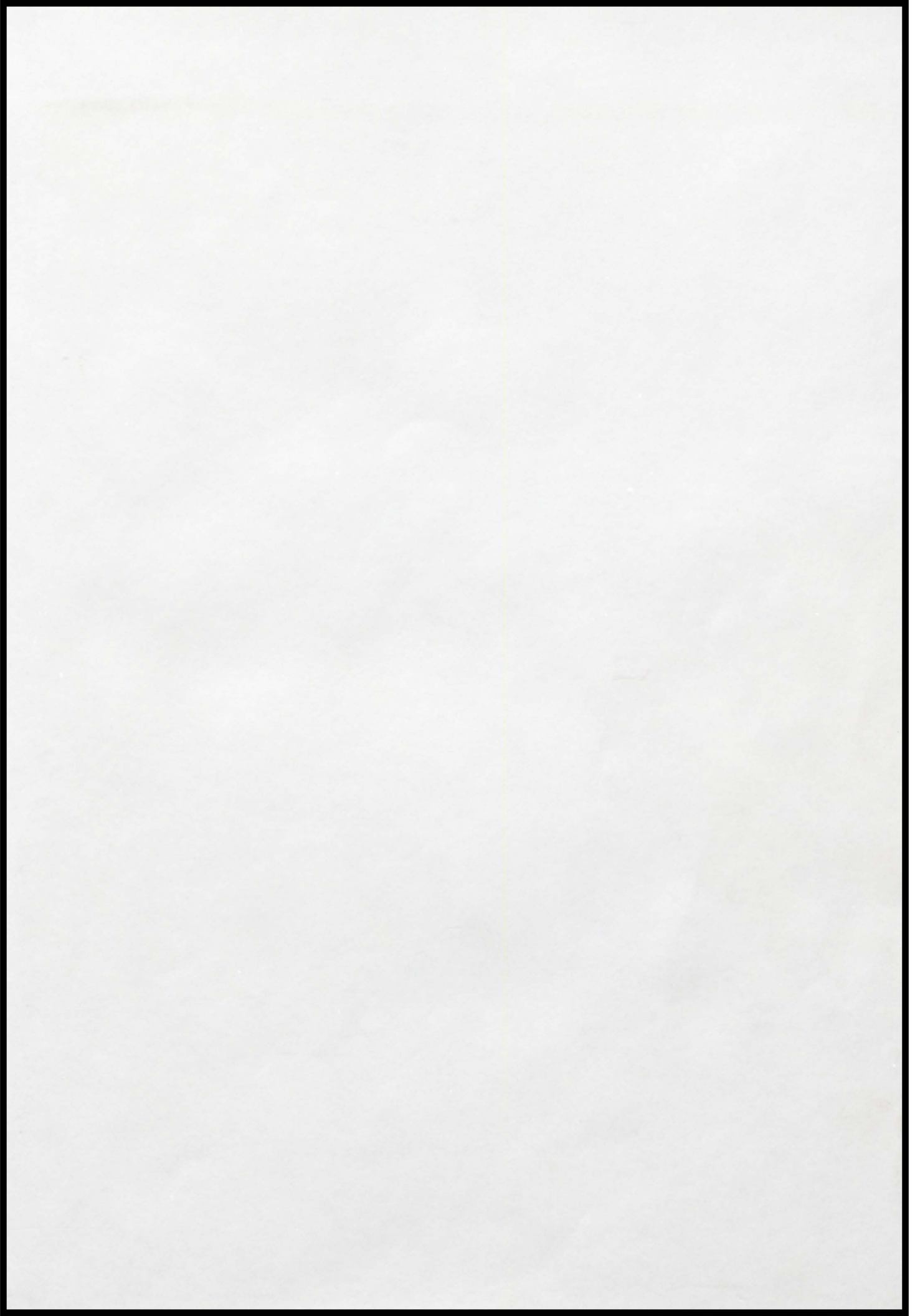

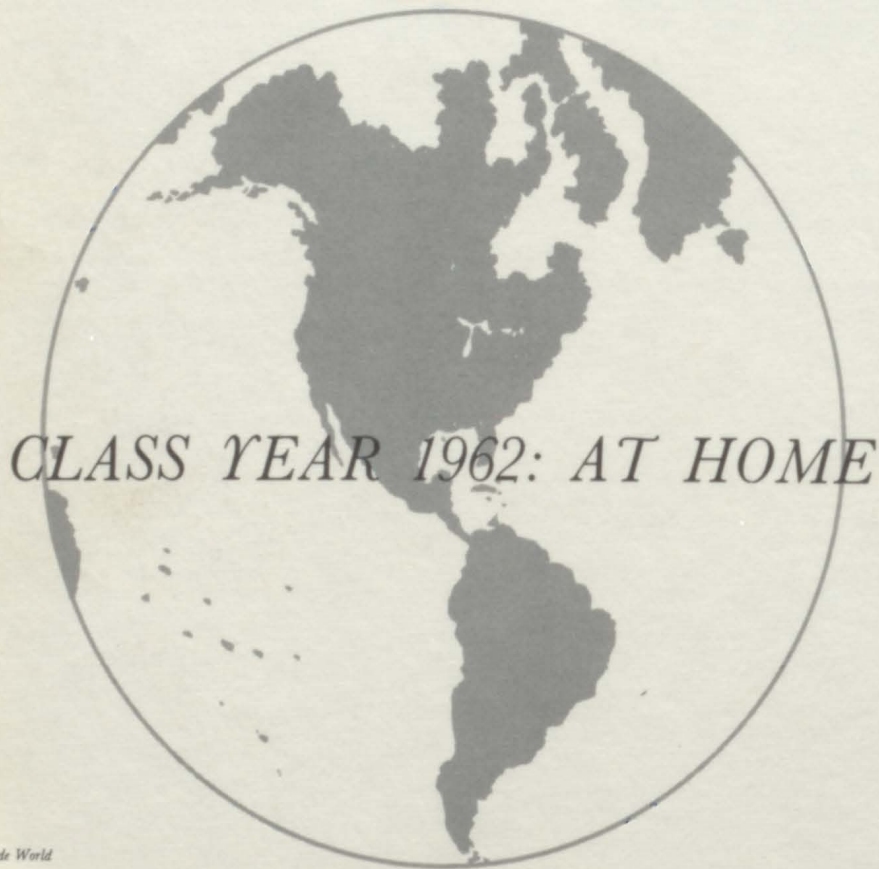
