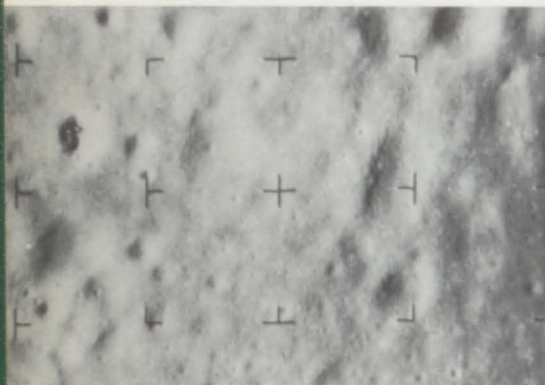

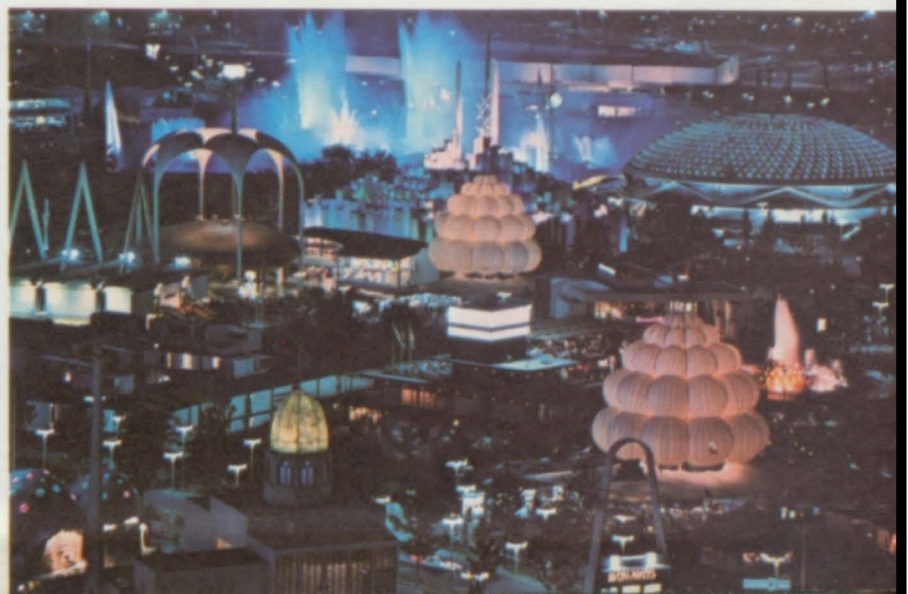

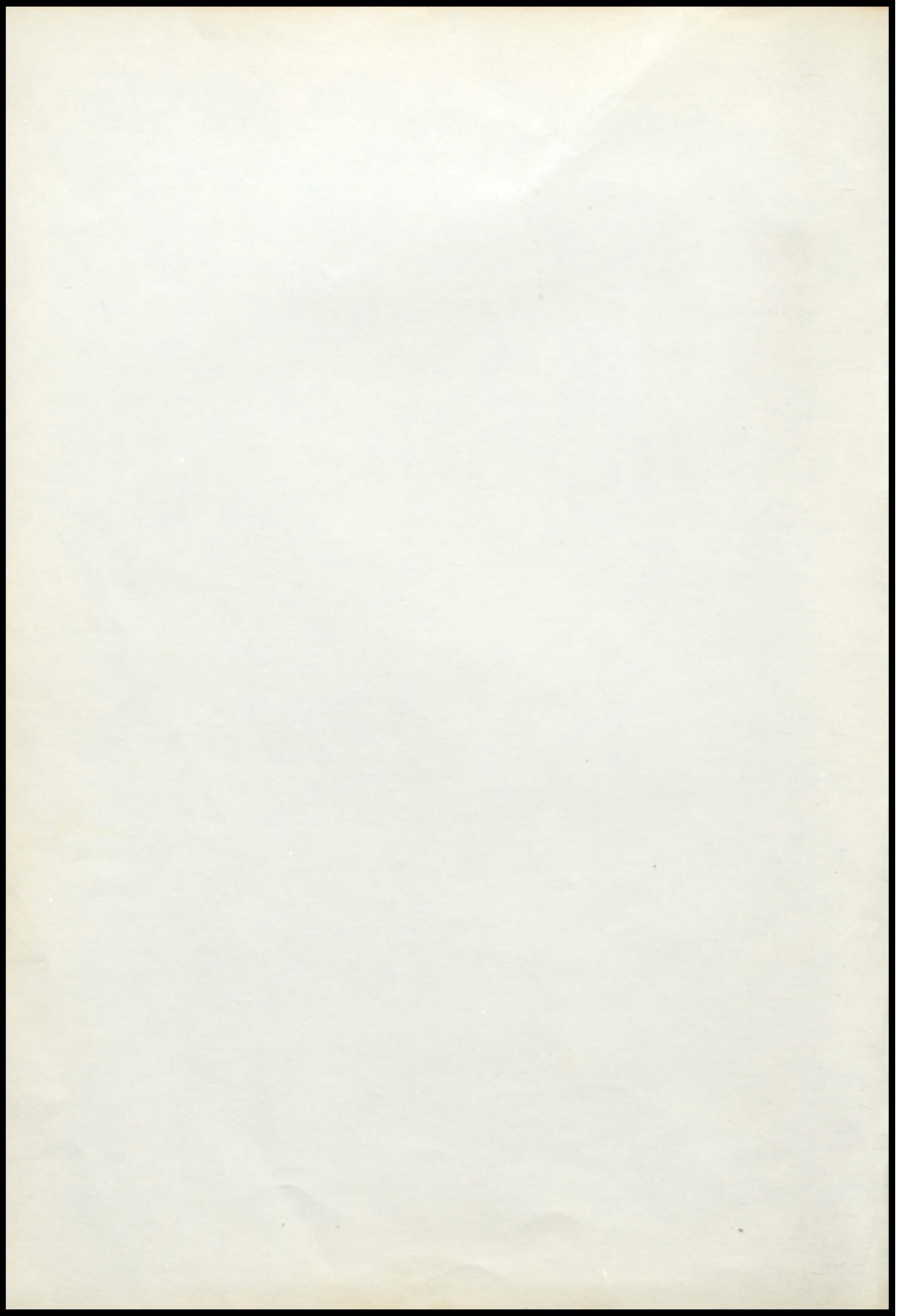

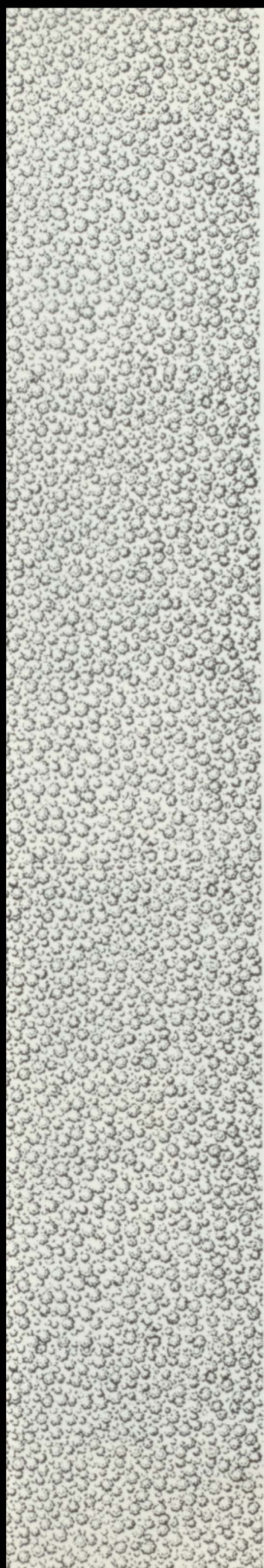

Coaches Sporer and Rigney agreed upon conclusion of the season that this team was the most outstanding group they had ever coached.

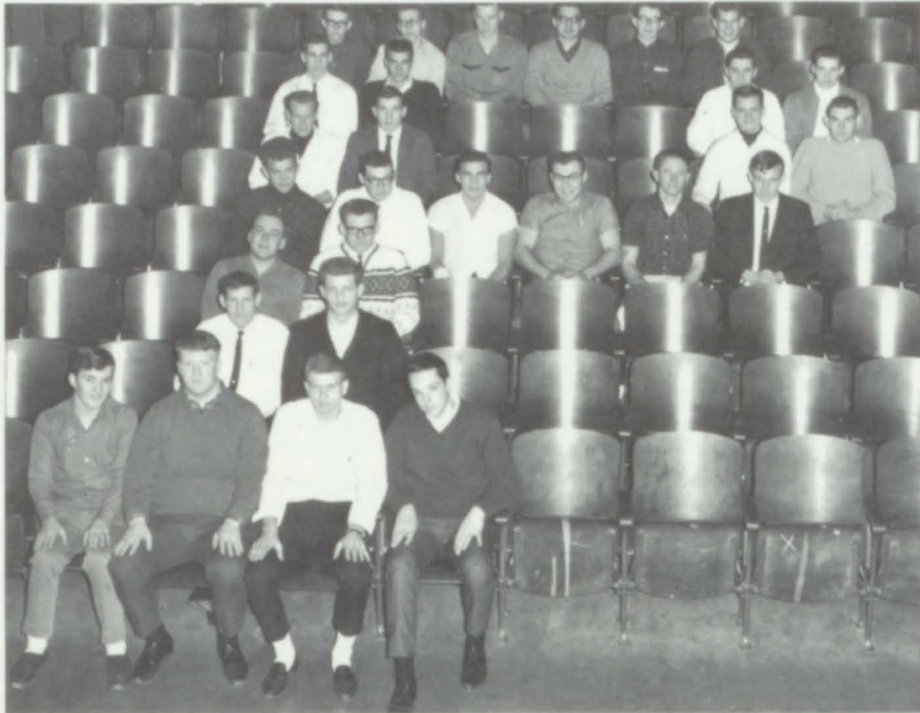

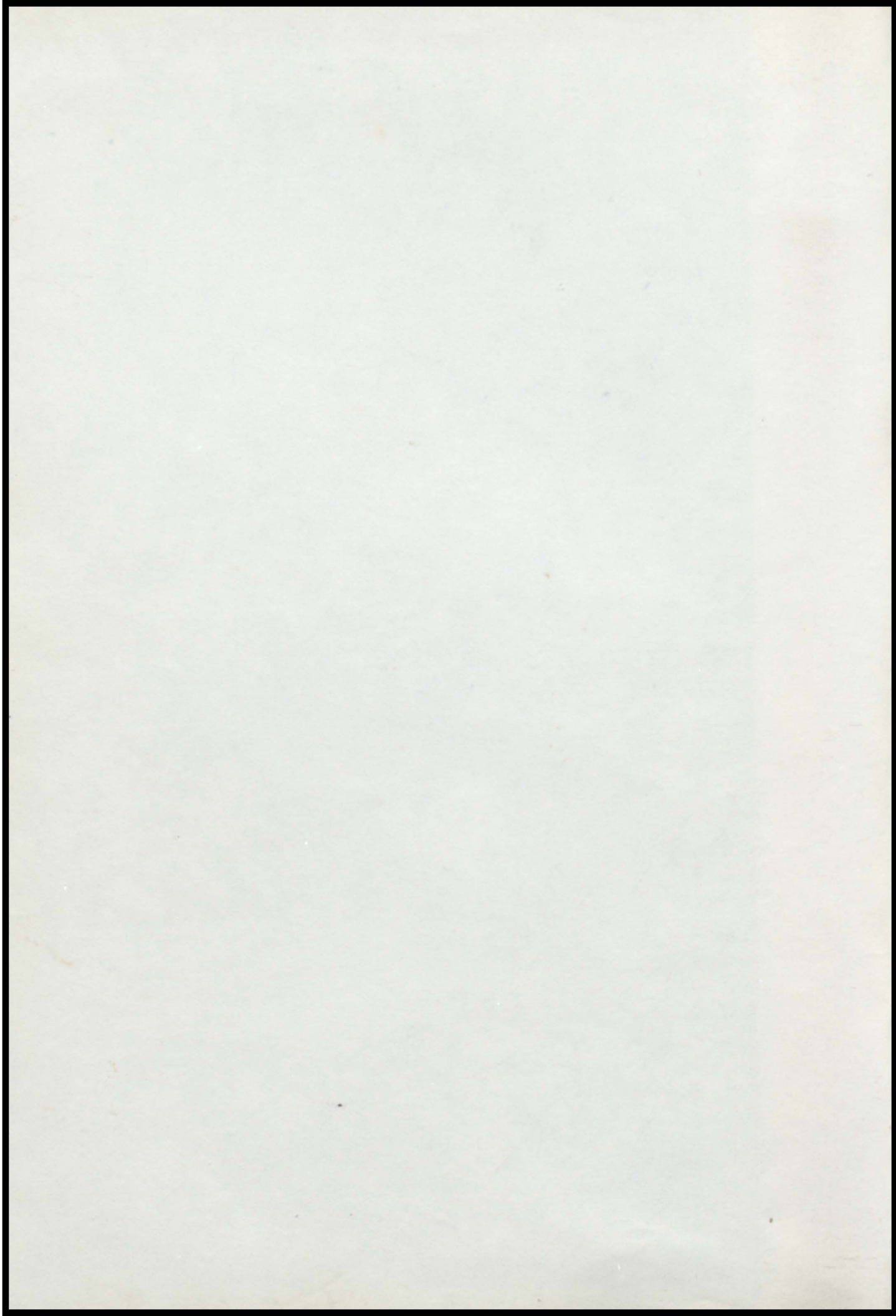
