





It was the most exciting moment when I learned that I was chosen to be on the AFS program. As I had applied for it, I began to read books about the USA trying to find out a few things about this nation. From the day I got my Host's family picture and application I was very excited. I was impatient the rest of the time, I didn't know what was going on in school. Fortunately it was only three weeks before I left school.


The day of departure was exciting as well as miserable. I could not help seeing my family saying goodbye to me as I entered the plane. After the plane took off from the airport, I couldn't wait to see my new family. I spent three days in New York which seemed to be about three weeks for I was very anxious to see my host family.

When I met them and stayed with them for a few days I found them to be more than what I expected them to be. They made me feel at home from the fifth of August 1968 til now.
