Page 20). It was decided by general consent to hold meetings on some Saturday once every month, and that a fee of 10 cents a month be given by each member. As a committee for arranging a program and refreshments for the 29, Hjalmar Johnson, Amanda Nelson and Ida Lamberg were selected.
- June 29 Meeting called to order by Rev. Hedden. The following ^{officers} nominated by committee were elected: Pres. Rev. Hedden. Vice Pres. Oscar Peterson Sec. Godfrey Nelson Treas. Agnes Lundblad. As an arrangement committee. Amanda Nelson Hjalmar Johnson and Emma Okeason. Dues of members collected. Lemonade and cake served. 70 cents, balance after payment of lemonade given treasurer.
- July 28 Special meeting for election of delegates to Luther League Convention at Rush City, Aug 3 and 4. Ida Lamberg and Godfrey Nelson selected.
- Aug 10 In invitation of Hjalmar Johnson, meeting held at his place. Meeting opened by Bible reading by Rev. Hedden. Report of Arrangement Committee concerning Ice Cream Social. Amt. sold for. \$20.60 Cost of Ice Cream \$10.00 Balance in treasury \$10.60 Treasurer reports amount in treasury now at \$14.80 Report of Ida Lamberg delegate to Luther League

Motion that Harvest Festival be held on 2nd Thursday in Nov. approved and carried. As an arrangement committee, besides ^{those} formerly elected, Oscar Peterson and Agnes Lundblad were also elected. As a decorating committee Emil Hanson, Alice Hanson and Godfrey Nelson were appointed. It was decided that admission to Festival should be 15 cents, and was to be paid at the door. As receiver of money at door Axel Hanson was selected. It was decided that no monthly dues should be paid in November and that this festival should take the place of the monthly meeting. The dues were now collected. Esther Johnson asked to become a member and was enrolled. Lunch was served and the evening passed pleasantly.

Hedeen. Entertained by a song by Mrs. Hedeen, a reading in Norwegian by Francis Nelson, and a reading concerning Farm life by Agnes Sundblad. New Year's Resolutions were discussed by Ida Lambert. Those who belong to society and leave for work in the different cities were requested to write home to society and let them know how they are progressing, and these letters are to be read at the next meeting. Meeting closed by singing a psalm. Refreshments tendered and a social time indulged in. Dues from members received and credited. Ruth Martinson, Emma, May and George Skowen asked to leave society.

Feb. 1. 1913. Upon the invitation of Oscar Lindberg meeting was held at this place. Many of the members were absent because of the disagreeable weather. The meeting was opened by a psalm and by a verse from the Bible by Rev. Hedeen. As officers for the coming year: Harry Peterson was elected Vice-President, Godfrey Nelson was re-elected Secretary, and Florence Sundblad was elected Treasurer. As an Arrangement Committee, Oscar Peterson, Henry Peterson and Agnes Sundblad were chosen. For the Programme Committee, Francis Nelson, Arvin Nelson and Hjalmar Johnson were elected. The minutes of the previous meeting read and accepted. A letter of greetings from Miss. Esther Sundblad was read to the members by the secretary.

Rev. Hedem. It was a story of two immigrants who had come to America; it shows that into whatever strange country one may come, he will find that God is supreme, and is the first as well as the best helper. Lunch was served and dues received and credited. Everyone returned home soon afterwards.

Feb. 21.

Through the invitation of Susan Peterson, meeting was held at their home. A good number were present altho the weather was stormy. The meeting was opened by a song by the girls and a bible verse by Rev. Hedem. Another song was given, after which Rev. Hedem gave a short discussion of the significance of Washington's birthday. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. The monthly dues were collected and credited. Refreshments were tendered and a social time takes place.

May 23.

Meeting was held at Lamberts upon their invitation. Meeting was opened by song. An allegory was read by Miss Pda Lambert. The minutes of meeting held Feb. 21, were read and approved. It was made known that the Luther League Convention was to be held at Spring Lake, June 28-29. It was decided that song books be purchased. Dues were collected, refreshments tendered and the evening passed.

June 13, 1913.

Meeting was held at Petmans. Song and Bible reading began the meeting. ^{Miss} Betty Petman was an editorial from a Swedish weekly. Another story in Swedish was given by Miss Ida Samberg. Next we joined in a song, after which the minutes of the previous meeting were read and stood approved as given. A picnic to be given after the 4th was to be considered and reported at the next church service. Dues were collected and credited. Lunch tendered and the meeting ^{for memory and} ~~closed~~ history.

July 12, 1913.

Upon the invitation of Jovin and Frances Nelson, the meeting was held at their home. The meeting was opened by song, and by Bible reading and prayer by Rev. Hedeen. It was decided that fifteen dollars be contributed by the society to the trustees for painting the church. The Luther League convention which was held the latter part of July was talked over by Rev. Hedeen. The minutes of previous meeting were read and stood approved. A couple of short stories in Swedish were read by Miss Helma Samberg and Miss Agnes Sundblad. Dues were then collected and credited, refreshments served and the evening was passed pleasantly.

July 26, 1913.

Meeting was held at the home of Alice and Axel Hanson upon their invitation. Altho the weather was threatening, a fair attendance was present. The meeting was opened by a song and by a short bible reading and prayer by Rev. Hedeen. The minutes!

As no business discussions were set up, the meeting closed. Refreshments were tendered after the dues had first been collected and credited.

Aug. 8, 1913.

Through the invitation of Pit Okerson, meeting was held at that place. Meeting was commenced by song and by Bible reading and prayer by Rev. Hadden. Another song was then sung by the members after which the minutes of the previous meeting were read by the secretary and stood approved as given. Upon suggestion it was decided that ten dollars were be turned over to the trustees to help pay cost of painting church. The meeting was closed by song. Next the dues were collected and credited, lunch served and a social time enjoyed.

Oct. 18/1913.

Nov. 7/1913 Meeting held at C. G. Johnsons place upon their invitation. Inclement weather and bad roads kept many away but quite a number came nevertheless. Among those absent was our President, Rev. Hedden. A few songs were joined in by those present and a cheerful time enjoyed by those present. Dues were collected and credited as usual. Refreshments served and the evening passed pleasantly.

Jan. 2/1914 Society invited to the home of Herman Johnson and finding that the first snow of the season the members and others assembled there. After they had gathered the meeting was opened by a song and by Bible reading by Rev. Hedden. After which another song was sung. The minutes of the previous meeting were asked for and read by the secretary. They stood approved and read. Next a song by Peterson quintette. Milton's sonnet on his blindness was recited by (Yvonne). Another song by society and it was over. Decided that annex for church, be considered, and suggestion be in order for next meeting. The matter was laid on the table until another time. Dues collected and credited, lunch tendered and the evening passed socially.

July 31, 1914

Upon invitation of Ida Lamberg, society met at her home. Meeting was opened by music and by Bible Reading by Rev. Hedeey. Next a vocal solo was rendered by Mrs. Hedeey. An organ selection was played by Miss Larson. The minutes of previous meeting were then read and approved of. It was reported by treasurer that we had the sum of \$89.80 in treasury at present. The bill for ice cream was presented for payment by Oscar Peterson. Meeting closed by devt. by Rev. & Mrs. Hedeey.

Aug 21, 1914.

Upon invitation of Alice and Axel Hanson meeting was held at their home. Meeting commenced by song and by Bible Reading by Rev Hedeen. Another song after which minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved of. It was decided that society pay cost of painting ^{amount of} church payable to trustees.
