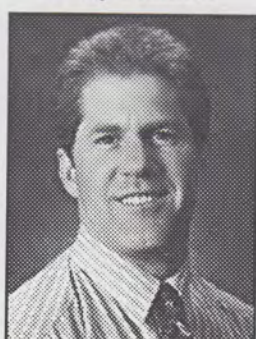

# INTRODUCTION

The county seat of Pine County, Pine City itself has a population of 2,468. The area surrounding the city has close to 5,500 people.

Situated at the southern end of a large county, the community is 65 miles north of Minneapolis-St. Paul and 90 miles south of Duluth. The estimated population of Pine County is 20,742 and it encompasses 906,362 miles.

Pine City is on the banks of the Snake River near its junction with Cross Lake. Pokegama Lake lies just west of the city, and nearby are the recreational opportunities offered by the St. Croix River and the Upper and Lower Snake.

Over 50 miles of shoreline and 3,000 acres of navigable waterway make Pine City an attractive recreation area. The Chengwatana State Forest and the nearby St. Croix State Park allow residents and visitors to pursue camping, hiking, cross country skiing and other outdoor activities.

Agriculture, light manufacturing and service-oriented work are the basis of the economy. Two shopping malls, Pine Plaza and Evergreen Square, plus a downtown business district, provide consumers with all types of goods and services.

A growing and prosperous community, Pine City is known for its volunteer spirit, its fine, hard working citizenry and outstanding city services.

# PINE CITY

Pine City is a progressive community with a growing population.

Among the city's facilities is the Pine City Municipal Building or city hall. It is conveniently located in the business district on 5th St. City Administrator Robert Voss and deputy clerk Chris Bloomquist keep office hours from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and can answer any questions regarding city services.

The municipal building also houses a community gathering room, available to the public for meetings and celebrations. Reservations for use of the room, which has a kitchen that may be used for a nominal fee, must be made in advance by stopping in the city office or calling 629-2575.

The Pine City Public Library can also be found in the municipal building. A branch of the East Central Regional Library System, its services go far beyond making reading material available to the public.

The city council meets on the first Wednesday of every month at 7:30 p.m. in the council chambers, which are part of city hall. The Pine City Planning Commission meets at 7:30 p.m. on the last Wednesday of each month.

Next to the municipal building is the city garage, which also houses the equipment and meeting room for the Pine City Fire Department. The non-emergency numbers for the fire department is 629-7405.

Lovely parks add to Pine City's popularity as a place to enjoy the Minnesota quality of life. Robinson Park in the downtown area has playground equipment, a gazebo shelter and picnic facilities, and the beach and recreation area on west 6th Ave. has horseshoe pits and a handball court, among other features.

A new park on the banks of the Snake River in the north part of Pine City offers boat and fishing piers, picnic facilities, a gazebo shelter and is the site of the huge redwood statue of a voyageur.

At the south edge of the city a new softball park features four fields and restroom facilities for use by the public and for area league play.

An active Chamber of Commerce provides information on business related functions as well as general information about Pine City and events in the area throughout the year.

Situated on Highway 61, 6th St., in downtown Pine City, the building houses the offices of all county officials, the county board meeting chambers, the district courtrooms and county welfare and human services offices, among others.

Much of the information about county government and business can be obtained from auditor Larry Perreault's office on the north end of the first floor. New residents can find plat books there or learn who their county commissioner and township officers are.

An elevator entrance on the north end of the courthouse provides access to the lower level as well as to the first and second floors of the courthouse.

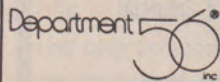

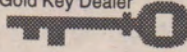

# WHERE TO VOTE

Pine City is in Minnesota's Eighth Congressional District.

Residents of Pine City, Pine City Township and the City of Rock Creek are in Minnesota Senate District 18 and House District 18B.

People who live in Pokegama, Munch, Mission Creek and Chengwatana townships and the cities of Brook Park and Henriette vote in Senate District 18 and House District 8B.

Royalton Township residents are in Senate District 18 and House District 18A.

In elections for Pine County Board seats, Pine City area residents vote in District 1 or District 2.

District 1 is made up of residents in Royalton Township, Pine City Township, Chengwatana Township, Pine City East Precinct and the City of Rock Creek.

District 2 voters are those who live in Pokegama Township, Mission Creek Township, Brook Park Township, Munch township, Crosby Township and Pine City West precinct.

For all local, state and national elections, people vote at the town hall of the township in which they reside.

In Pine City Council elections, city residents are divided into two precincts, Pine City East for those who live east of Highway 61, and Pine City West for those who live west of the highway. The polling place for both precincts is city hall.

Pine City School District No. 578 encompasses about 5,000 homes in and around the Pine City area. Elections to the seven-member school board are held every May. The polling place is city hall.

Residents of townships in Pine County vote every March for officers on their town boards. Polling places are the respective town halls.

# HUMAN SERVICES

Pine County Department of Human Services is located in the courthouse. There is also a branch office in the city hall in Sandstone.

The department is organized into five program units: Administration and Accounting, Adult Services, Child Support & Fraud Investigation, Children Services, and Financial Assistance. In addition, the

department funds more than a dozen community based services, among them Five County Mental Center, Pine County Development Achievement Center, Grindstone Lodge, Pine Shores & Meadow Creek Chemical Dependency Services, Therapeutic Services Agency, St. Croix Camp, Community Involvement Programs, Private Industry Council Five, Pine County Home Health Care and Homemaker Services and area nursing homes.

The branch office in Sandstone provides mental health care, developmental disabilities and adult foster care services, in addition to a full range of financial assistance programs.

Children Services is located in the courthouse. They provide child protection, foster care, day care information, adoption, minor mother and supportive services.

The Child Support Office establishes and enforces child support orders, including the establishment of paternity and wage withholding orders. The unit is also involved in collections. Fraud referrals are made to the fraud investigation officer located in this office.

The Financial Assistance Unit administers federal and state welfare programs, including Aid to Families with Dependent Children, General Assistance, Food Stamps and Medical Assistance. In addition to those programs, the unit contracts with the Private Industry Council for a wide variety of employment assistance programs. Those programs are located at Pine Technical College.

In total, the department administers more than \$15 million in federal, state and local social service and financial assistance programs. Nearly all of the programs are mandated by federal or state laws. For more information call 320-629-6781 or 1-800-450-7463.

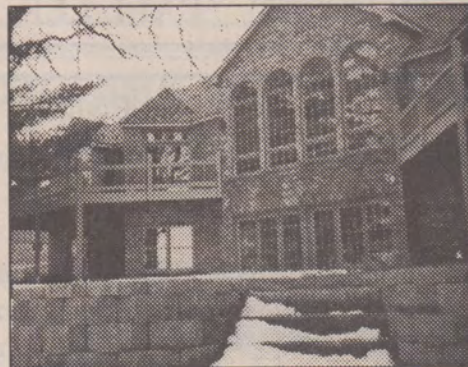

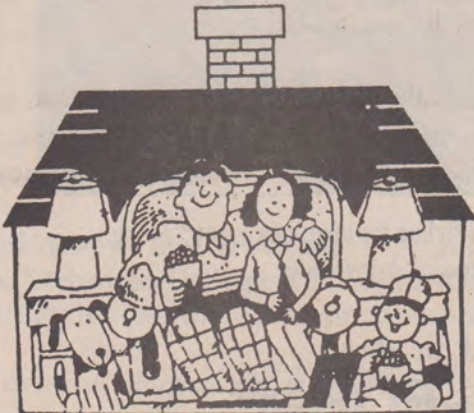

# LEGAL SERVICES

Legal Aid Service of Northeastern Minnesota (LASNEM), headquartered in Duluth, has a Pine City branch office which provides free legal advice and representation to low income people who live in Pine and Kanabec counties.

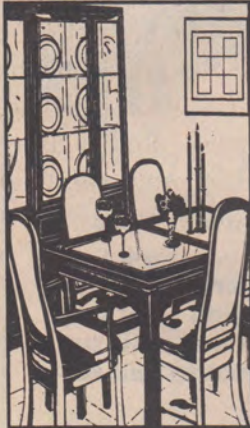

# HEALTH CARE

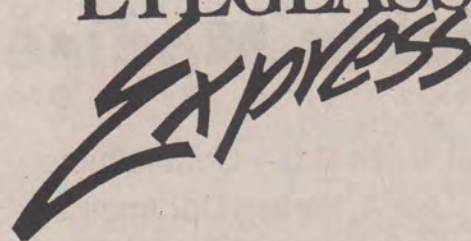

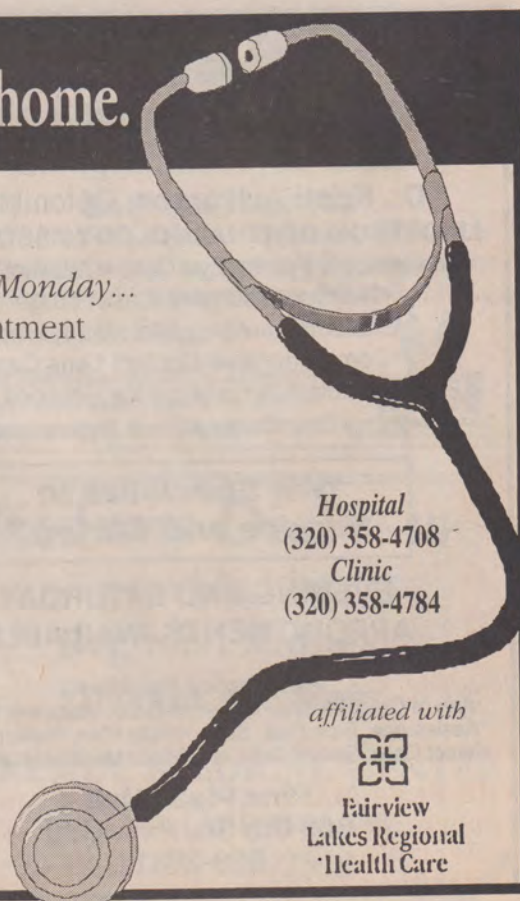

# EDUCATION

Education is a top priority in Pine City, as its modern school facilities and innovative classes prove. There are about 1,700 students enrolled in kindergarten through 12th grade.

A certified teacher runs the programs, under the guidance of a board of directors. The board is made up of parents who send their children to the school. Parents also participate in school operations. Contact teacher Nancy Anderson at 629-2255 for more information.

The Pine City Area Learning Center, behind Pine Technical College, serves as the alternative school for students in Pine City School District. It also administers GED and adult brush-up classes Monday evenings from 5-8 p.m. at Pine Technical College. Call 629-3571 for more information.

# SENIOR SERVICES

Pine City senior citizens are always busy at the senior center.

Located on 6th St., across from the elementary school, the building is accessible to people with disabilities and has been remodeled to accommodate a variety of activities. A kitchen allows the noon congregate dining program to operate efficiently at the center and makes serving small lunches convenient during other events. Friendly Visiting, a daily telephone check-in program, operates through the center.

Card games and bingo are weekly activities at the senior center, and it's a nice place to go just to visit.

## SENIOR DINING

Hot, nutritious noon meals are offered Monday through Friday at the Pine City Senior Center. The meals are served in a group setting, giving seniors the opportunity to socialize. Volunteers are always welcome to help serve.

The only requirement to participate in the program is the person be 60 years of age or older, and they must phone in their reservation for lunch one day in advance. A \$2 or more donation is suggested and encouraged. Spouses of any age may accompany those who are eligible for the program. Guests under age 60 pay \$4.25.

Home delivered meals are available to seniors who are unable, for medical or other reasons, to get to the center or prepare a meal for themselves. Frozen meals can be delivered or picked up at the center once a week, especially for those in rural areas.

Menus for each week are printed in the Pine City Pioneer. Anyone who qualifies and is interested in the Nutrition Center program can reserve a meal or get more information by calling 629-3024 between 9:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. Geri Othoudt is the director.

## HOME NURSING CARE

Homebound senior citizens who need professional nursing care, help with physical therapy, housekeeping assistance or personal care may have the services provided through the county nurse's office. # SANITATION & RECYCLING

## SANITATION

Abe and Henry Korf provide sanitation service in Pine City and the surrounding area with their Pine City Garbage Service.

Henry handles residential garbage collection. He can be reached by calling 629-3669. Abe is the rural residential and commercial garbage collector. His phone number is 629-2089.

Pine City Garbage Service offers curbside pickup of recyclables on the second Tuesday of every month. The recycling service is free to their customers. Those who don't use Korfs' garbage service pay a nominal fee for curbside pickup of recyclables.

## RECYCLING

Pine City area residents have a variety of options for disposing of recyclable material.

Several recycling drop sheds are located in and around Pine City. The sheds are open 24 hours every day, and residents may leave recyclables inside in the appropriate bins. Sheds can be found at Nelson's Market and Jubilee Foods in Pine City, at Rock Creek Motor Stop at Highway 70 and I-35 or behind the town hall in Henriette. Sheds are also located in Beroun and Brook Park.

Pine County's Zoning and Solid Waste Department is responsible for the sheds. To use them as efficiently as possible, follow the following instructions:

Aluminum cans should be clean, dry and flattened lengthwise.

Corrugated cardboard should be clean, dry, flattened and tied securely.

Glass bottles and jars should be clean and dry. The caps should be removed and the glass separated by color (clear, green or brown). Only food and beverage

bottles and jars are accepted.

Newspapers should be clean, dry and bagged or tied securely.

Plastic should be clean and dry and caps and metal rings should be removed. Containers should be flattened. Only PETE (No. 1) and HDPE (No.2) plastics with a bottleneck are accepted.

Tin and steel cans should be clean and dry. Paper labels should be removed, the ends removed and the cans flattened lengthwise.

For more information on the county recycling program call 1-800-450-7463, ext. 122.

Stan and Gene's Auto and Salvage, just north of Pine City on Highway 61, takes some recyclables.

In addition to all types of scrap metal, Stan and Gene's accepts aluminum cans, tin cans and auto batteries. The business is open from 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and until noon on Saturday. For more information call 629-2030.

Pine City Garbage Service picks up recyclables on the second Tuesday of every month. All items must be sorted and left at the curb. Korfs accept aluminum and tin cans, recyclable plastics and glass, cardboard and newspaper.

All garbage from the Pine City area goes to the East Central Solid Waste Commission facility west of Mora on Highway 23. The facility is open Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and Saturday from 8 a.m. to noon. The phone number is 320-384-6596.

The public may take garbage to the Mora facility for disposal or area residents may haul it to a transfer station on Highway 61 north of Beroun and one-half mile east of I-35.

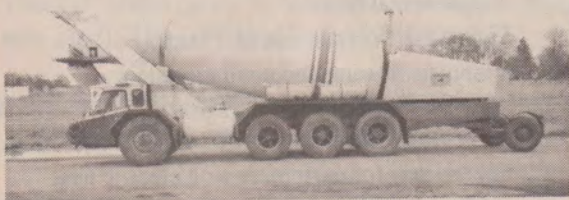
The transfer station is open from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and from 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays. The cost is \$49 per ton of garbage.

For appliances and automobile tires there is a fee. Mattresses are accepted; the charge is by the pound.

The transfer station will not accept liquids of any kind, including paint, oil filters, auto or ATV batteries, fluorescent lamps, ash in burning barrels (which are illegal in Minnesota) or household hazardous waste.

Diabetic sharps can be deposited at no charge if they are in a coffee can which is tightly sealed with packing tape and labeled.

Herbicide and pesticide containers are also accepted if they are triple rinsed. The owner will be asked to sign a disclaimer to that effect.

## LEISURE

Parks are among Pine City's most delightful features.

Robinson Park, in the downtown area, is a nice spot to read or relax. It's a popular place for family gatherings and community events, equipped as it is with a lovely brick gazebo. The shelter is used by picnickers and as a backdrop for musical groups which entertain in the park on Friday evenings in the summer.

Picnic tables, grills, water fountains and electrical outlets are among the park's other features.

The lively place to spend time during the summer is West Side Park on 6th Ave. Its public swimming beach, with bathhouses and lifeguards on duty daily, make it an ideal spot to spend time with the kids.

Swimming lessons are offered at the beach and at Hinckley's indoor pool in June and July. The schedule is announced in the local newspaper.

Other facilities at the park include playground equipment, picnic tables and a shelter, grills, a fenced horseshoe area with eight sets available, basketball courts and a three-wall handball court.

For young children, Pine City has a Robert Leathers playground. The multi-level, wood con-

struction fantasy land features a castle, a dragon, a banana split boat, slides, swings, a car and much more.

Located on the grounds of Pine City Elementary School, the playground was built with the volunteer help of nearly everyone in the community, under the direction of architects from Robert Leathers firm in New York. It is open to the public daily, and picnic tables are incorporated in the design.

A city park on the north bank of the Snake River in Pine City offers boat moorings, picnic tables, grills, restrooms, walking paths and a nature pond. A carved redwood voyageur statue is the focal point of the park. The area is fully accessible to people with disabilities.

Just across Highway 61 from the new Riverside Park is the Snake River Landing. Redesigned in 1989, the landing is nicely landscaped, completely blacktopped and offers ample parking for cars and trailers.

Another public access to Cross Lake was completed in 1993. It can be found on the east side of the lake on County Road 9. Pokegama Lake, west of Pine City, is also accessible to the public via a landing on County Road 7.



## LIBRARIES

The Pine City Public Library is a branch of the East Central Regional Library headquartered in Cambridge.

Located in Pine City Hall on 5th St., the library is open Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from noon to 6 p.m., Wednesdays from noon to 7:30 p.m. and Saturday from 9 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

Librarian Christy Koch is a ready source of answers to any questions regarding the library's many services.

As part of the East Central Regional Library system, a special reference service can be offered. Interlibrary book loan and an extensive collection of large print books are available.

For a nominal fee the library has computers, typewriters, a fax machine, a copier and a microfilm reader-printer for public use. A VCR, slide

projector, 16mm projector and compact disc player, along with video tapes and compact discs, are at the disposal of Pine City residents through the library, as is a microfiche catalog. Old local newspapers are featured on microfilm.

During the course of the year the library is the site for many special programs for children and adults in the community, including the summer reading programs and story hours.

The library board cooperates with the Pine City Arts Council to allow the library to serve as the showcase for work entered in art contests offered by the council. All are attempts by the library staff and its patrons to help community members become acquainted with all the library has to offer.

# LICENSES

Any type of motor vehicle license or sporting license can be purchased at Pine City's license center.

The office is at 809 6th St. in Pine City. The phone number is 629-2560.

There's no need to wait for the state to send the license for your car, truck, RV, boat trailer, ATVs, cycle or snowmobile. They're all available at the office of the deputy registrar. You can also renew your driver's license there.

Hunting, fishing and trapping licenses can also be purchased there, as well as at the hardware stores and bait stores.

Office hours are from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Written driver's license tests are given on Mondays at 10 a.m. and again at 2 p.m. in the community room of the Pine City Municipal Building.

Road tests are by appointment only. Applicants must arrange, in person, to take the road test. The license examiner cannot be reached by phone to make appointments or to cancel them.

Those who pass the test are issued a temporary

license until the permanent license arrives in about two to three weeks.

Vehicle title transfers are done at the license center on 6th St. To transfer a title, the owner needs to bring a certificate of title with him, his insurance number and driver's license.

To obtain a license on an automobile, truck and other vehicles, the owner must have the number of the insurance policy under which he is covered.

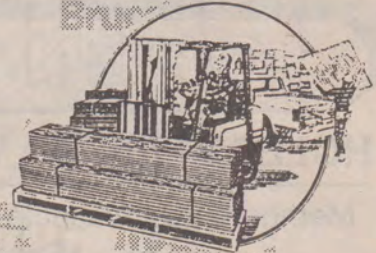

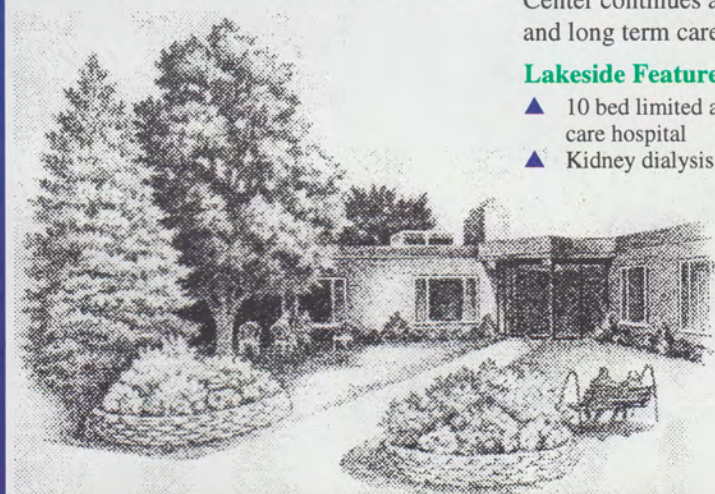

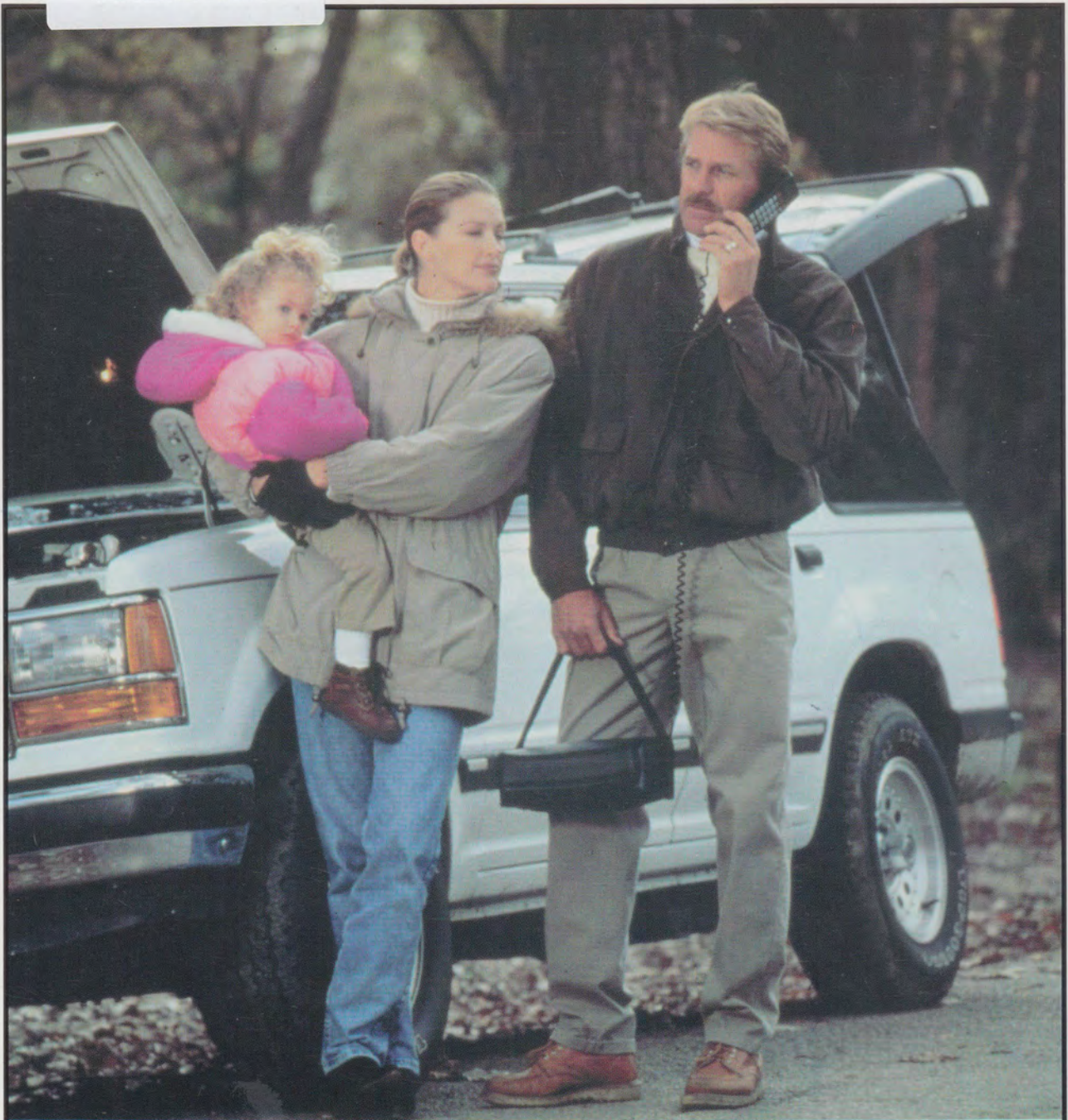
