Church History

The Methodist Episcopal Society of Pine City, Minnesota, was organized by Richard N. Avison in February, 1887. At that time there were but four members, viz: Walter P. Gottry, Mrs. M. Warner, Mrs. Jennie Chubb and Miss Lilla Stephan. Rev. Avison was acting minister in charge until the following October Conference, when the charge was left unsupplied.

On April 1st, 1888, Rev. S. W. Simonds was appointed to the charge by Presiding Elder S. B. Warner.

On July 17th of the same year, the foundation of the new church building was begun, and was dedicated by Dr. Robert Forbes October 21st, assisted by the Pastor, S. W. Simonds. The total expense of the building was \$1,550.00, \$300 being raised at the time of dedication, leaving a debt on the church to the amount of \$801. The Ladies Aid Society as well as the Young Peoples Society rallied to the cause, put new carpets on the floor, and did much to lift the burden of debt.

This building, with some repairs and alterations, was used as a place of worship for thirty-nine years, until April 15th, 1927 the old building was wrecked to make room for the new beautiful edifice that now occupies the same spot.

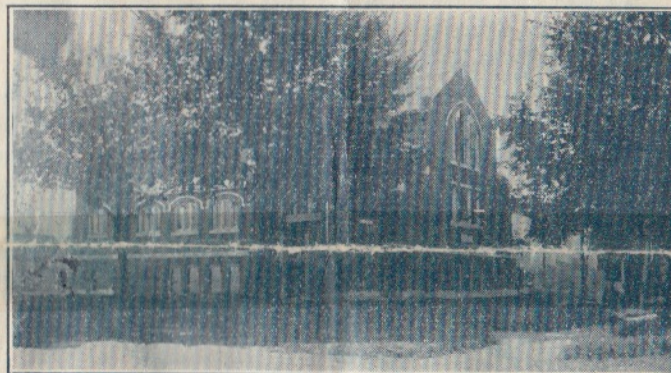

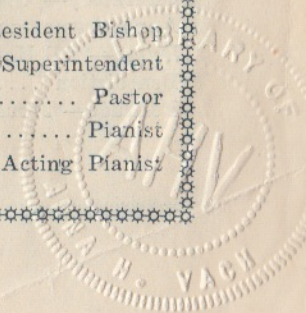
