Crystal Palace was built by Walter Schwartzwald in 1934, since June of that year operated the ballroom. 1938, he add the bowling alley, which proven to be very popular. In 1945, Schwartzwald sold Clem Gramer of Fairfax, Mn. In 1946, Gramer made interior changes by the installation of twenty-four booths which encicled the dance floor. A service window was cut in the east wall, to facilitate waitress service in the dance section. Mr. Gramer owner of the former Schwartzwald Crystal Ballroom changed the of the establishment to "Topic Ballroom".

Mercantile Co.

Pine City Mercantile, a partnership of which F. C. Land president H. W. Hart Vice President + F. A. Brown secy treasurer was organized + began business Dec 1 - 1908. Line consisted of dry goods, ladies' ^{men's children's} furnishings, clothing, hardware, groceries, furniture, Carpets, drugs, paints, oils, lumber + building materials. Employed 12 ^{more} people during rush season.
