

One of the very important choices we will have to make in the General Election on November 5th will be for State Representative from Kanabec and Pine Counties.

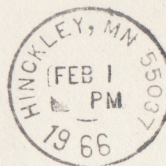

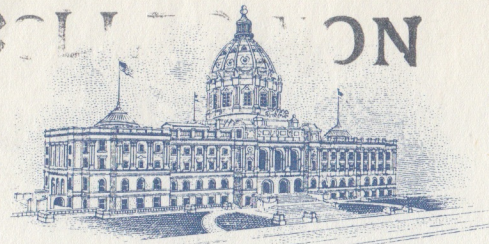

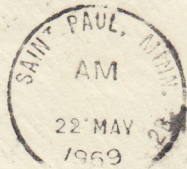

Also, he has found the plot of Chugwater Town site and expects to have ~~it~~ a copy made of that also.

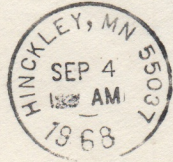

Yes, Joe Gimpl did introduce two junior college bills, for Mora and for Pine City. This action **MOST DEFINITELY STRENGTHENED THE CASE** for a junior college in this area. Continued study of our area as a site for a junior college was assured by the introduction of these bills by Joe Gimpl. To indicate otherwise shows only a complete lack of knowledge of the legislative process.

- FACT TWO -

Joe Gimpl's opponent indicates that neither junior college bill ever reached the floor of the House for a vote. He apparently just doesn't know how legislative bills are handled. All junior college bills, 30 in number, were combined and studied, then finally incorporated in House File 2626 WHICH WAS BROUGHT TO THE FLOOR OF THE HOUSE FOR A VOTE ON MAY 20, 1967. The result is recorded in Session Laws of Minnesota For 1967, Chapter 868 Section 29, which directed the study to be made of junior college sites IDENTIFIED IN BILLS INTRODUCED IN THE 1967 SESSION.

- FACT THREE -

Joe Gimpl has pledged to continue to work for a junior college in our area. He has stated, "I represent both counties and the communities therein. If a junior college is recommended for this area by the study commission, I will support this recommendation. I will continue to work for a junior college for our area, as I have for the past four years. If a junior college is not recommended for our area at this time, I will work to have the state pay state aid directly to students disadvantaged by reason of distance from institutions of higher learning to compensate them for the savings realized by students who have the advantage of living at home."
