HISTORY

- July 30,1914 ARMORY COMPLETED and designated a MINNESOTA NAVAL MILITIA ARMORY
 - 1ST UNIT STATIONED WAS 3RD Division-7th NAVAL AREA (held summer training on Lake Superior practiced life saving on Cross Lake)
- April 6,1917 MINNESOTA NAVAL MILITIA ordered to mobilize for World War I ... After the war, the Pine City unit was not reformed. Armory was vacant until 1924
 - May 29, 1924 BATTERY E, 2nd Battalion, 125th Field Artillery was mustered into the Minnesota National Guard and stationed in Pine City. Equipped with horse drawn 75mm guns from World War I.
 - 1936 Horses were replaced by trucks for towing guns
 - February1941 Battery mobilized for federal service
 - February1943 Battery shipped out for European theatre of war.
 - November1946 A "new" unit, Battery C,257th Antiaircraft Artillery Automatic Weapons Battalion was assigned to Pine City Armory
 - 1977 NEW ARMORY BUILT and Naval Militia Armory became property of school district before being sold to City

COMMUNITY USE OF ARMORY .. throughout its history, the armory was used for community events including basketball games, dances, funerals and parties.

Pine City Naval Militia Armory

ISTORIC NAME:

The Pine City Naval Militia Armory occupies three lots in a residential neighborhood east of Pine City's business district. Cross Lake is several hundred feet east of the building.

The armory, designed by the Duluth architectural firm of Kelly and Williams in 1913, is a rectangular brick and concrete structure. A two story rectangular office area occupies the front with a gymnasium-drill space attached to its rear. The office area is constructed of higher grade brick thus creating a difference in color between the two sections. The concrete foundation rises approximately three feet above grade.

The hipped roof office area is topped by a simple brick parapet and cornice. A tall brick chimney is located at the southwest corner. The central entrance, adorned by transom and side lights, is situated in a projecting portal. Two inscription stones and a pair of decorative cartouches are located in the central portion of the front facade. Fenestration is symmetrical, piercing the building with sets of three three-over-one double hung windows. Pilaster strips separate the windows in each group with the exception of those windows above the central entrance. The original crenelated brickwork above the door and the parapet has been removed or capped by cement.

The single story gymnasium-drill space is covered by a low-pitched gable roof. Five large segmental arched openings defined by brick pilaster strips are located on the east side. A large door originally located in the central opening has been replaced with a smaller service door and the larger opening has been infilled; the remaining four openings contain three multipane double hung windows. Similar openings on the west side have been removed, boarded over, or have had window replacements. A brick belt course consisting of headers is located above the windows.

Two brick garage additions (ca.1930s and 1940) have been added to the rear and west sides of the armory. Both have many of the features of the original structure, including multipane windows and a raised concrete foundation.

Blueprints for the armory and additions are in possession of the Pine City Public School System, the present owner of the structure. The building is presently being used as a gymnasium and for adult education.

SIGNIFICANCE

The Naval Militia building in Pine City is significant as the first of two armories erected by the state of Minnesota solely for the use of the state's naval militia. The Minnesota Naval Militia, organized in 1903, was located exclusively in Duluth for ten years. In 1913, the Third Division was established in Pine City. Members of the unit trained in the armory's gymnasium and on Cross Lake several hundred feet east of the armory; they also participated in annual training excursions on the Great Lakes. When the United States declared war on Germany on April 6, 1917, the naval militia was the state's first armed force mobilized for action. The Third Division, consisting of 35 officers and enlisted men, embarked on April 8 for Philadelphia and service on the Atlantic Ocean. The division disbanded after the war due to the lack of local interest. The armory, a center of community activities since its construction in 1914, housed a -national guard unit for nearly five decades before being sold to the city's school system in 1977. The building is also significant as one of the first armories to be completed under a 1913 state law which provided state financial assistance for construction of local armories.

The other armory, constructed in 1916, is located in Crosby.
