in Pine City last Sat.

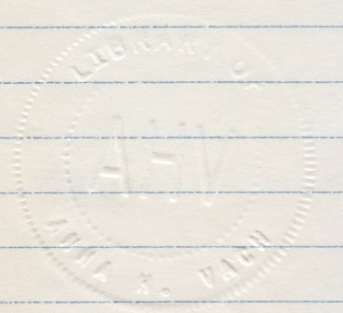
May 24 - 1923 Pine Pokes
