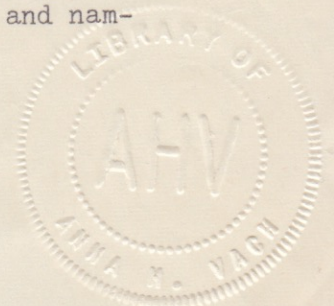

Location on northeast corner of Second Ave. and Third St.

Hiram Brackett was the first to make improvements in Pine City and was the first postmaster. Owner of a sawmill, located on the south bank of Snake River. The block between 9th & 8th Sts. north of 2nd. Ave.

Capt. Richard G. Robinson was a land examiner for the Lake Superior and Mississippi Railroad Company for 12 years. While living in Pine City, engaged in lumbering and Real Estate. The park was a gift of Capt. Robinson, which had been adorned and embellished and named after him.

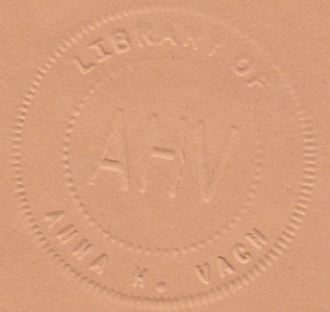

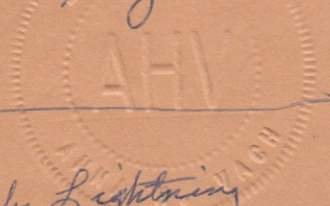

The first courthouse was destroyed by fire. The records of county government in Chingwatani are very meager.

The first District court was held in Oct 1872. Judge Crosby presiding John D. Wilcox <sup>clerk</sup> and clerk, and Edward Jackson Sheriff.

Until 1872 Pine Co. was attached for judicial purposes to Chicago County.

March 22 1884 - John Cope and Tom Leonard arrested for drunkenness and disorderly conduct, were confined in Pine City jail, the wooden structure. About 3 o'clock A.M., the jail was aflame, all efforts fail to save the two men and the Building. Cause of the fire unknown.

H. J. Rath appointed as deputy sheriff. 1886.

R. J. Hawley elected as sheriff 1898.
