Pine County was famous for its potatoes, for the wonderful quantity production as well as their fine wonderful qualities. Many of the seed potatoes for the South were grown in the county.

An acre yielded from 250 to 300 bushels. They sold for 50c per bushel in the fall to \$1.05 per bushel later in the year.


