LAMBERT SISTERS BUY OUT BEECHELS

A deal was closed Tuesday where-
by Misses Lillian and Bess Lambert
became proprietors of the West Side
Grocery, buying out Chas. H. Beechel
who for the past seven years has con-
ducted the store. Mr. Beechel pur-
chased the Schumaker business
seven years ago and moved it from
the present Koenitz billiard hall lo-
cation to its present location west of
the postoffice.

The Lamberts of course need no in-
ter. They have been here all their lives;
were born and raised here, and ever
ever since they left last fall have
wanted to come back.

The new proprietors expect to take
over the business on March 22nd, and
will be glad to meet you there after
that date.

The Beechels have been here for the
past 12 years, seven of the twelve
having been spent in the grocery busi-
ness. Both have been active in lodge
and church circles, and will be missed
should their future plans call for a
removal from this city. At present
they have no definite program for the
summer, and will probably take a good
rest. Mrs. Beechel has been in ill
health for a time and will spend
some time recuperating.

Because of their wide acquaintance
in this community the proprietors of
the new store should do well, and we
bespeak for them the success they
deserve.

FROM OUR FILES: Lambert's Grocery & Pine City Bakery

In April of 1928 Fred Skrbeck built a new building adjoining the west wall of the Lambert Grocery, located on 3rd Ave SW. Mr. Skrbeck then opened the Pine City Bakery in the new building.

TO BUILD A NEW BAKERY BUILDING

Mr. Skrbeck, the new owner of the Neubauer property, the store building occupied by the Lambert grocery and the house on the corner, was in the village the forepart of the week arranging for the construction of a new building to house his bakery.

The new building will be built adjoining the west side of the Lambert grocery and with an entrance between the two stores. The new building will be modern in every respect and with modern bakery equipment. Construction of the building will start in a few days. It will be 70 feet long and one story.

The Lambert sisters will remain in their present location.

PINE CITY BAKERY TO OPEN IN A FEW DAYS

The Pine City Bakery, located just west of the Lambert Grocery is nearly completed and Mr. Skrbeck, the owner, expects to open for business either Saturday or Monday. The building has just been completed, the machinery and fixtures are being installed, and when completed will be fixed up in first class shape.

HINCKLEY MAN TO OPEN GROCERY STORE

Art Thompson of Hinckley has leased the front half of the Pine City Bakery building, from Fred Skrbeck, and will open a grocery store. The interior of the building is being remodeled and equipment installed for the store. The new store will open about February 15th, according to present plans. Mr. Thompson has a grocery store at Hinckley which he will continue to operate, together with the one here.

Mr. Skrbeck will continue his bakery, using the rear half of the building which provides plenty of space for his business.

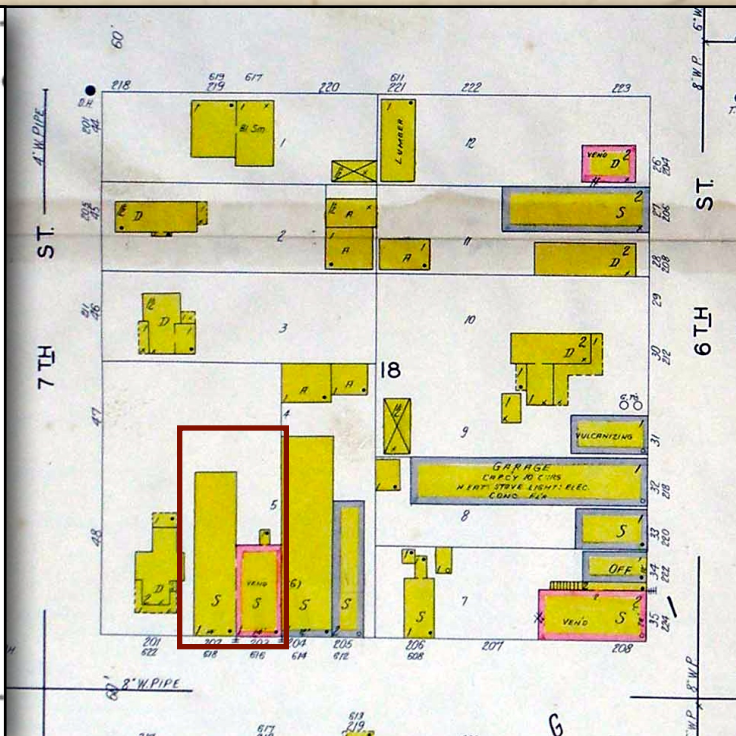
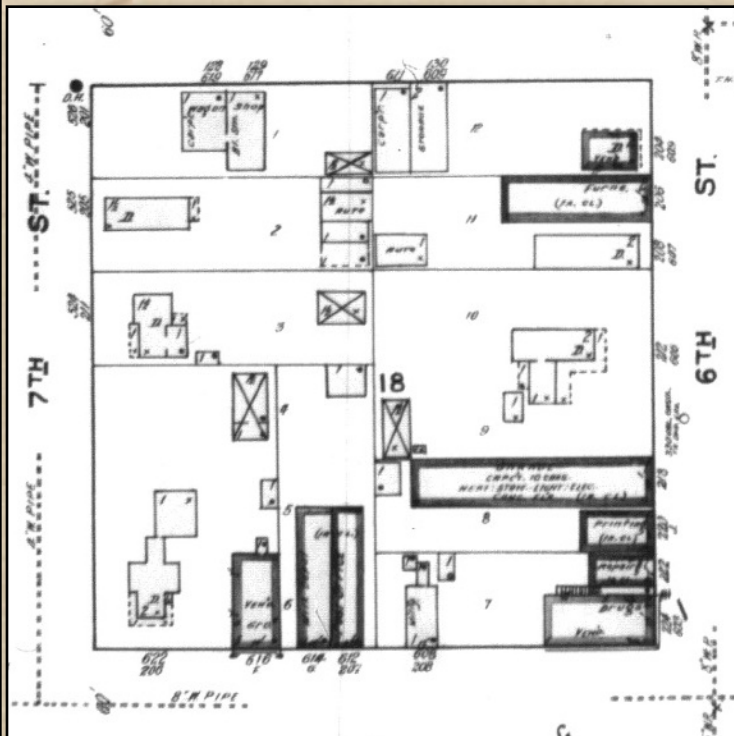
