Call "Repair Service" if your telephone is out of order.

Call "Chief Operator" to inquire about a call in the process of completion.

Call "Manager's Office" for all business transactions such as applications for service, changes in service, directory listings, directory advertising, inquiries regarding bills or charges, or to report unsatisfactory service of any kind.

HOW TO USE THE TELEPHONE

Obtain the correct telephone number from the directory.

If the person you wish to speak to is not listed in the directory, call "Information."

Speak slowly, clearly and directly into the telephone with your lips about one inch from the mouthpiece, so that you will not be misunderstood.

On a COMMON BATTERY TELEPHONE (one where you signal the operator by merely lifting the receiver from the hook) to recall the operator on a connection, move the receiver hook up and down slowly three or four times. Do not hang up the receiver

until you are through with the connection, as this gives the operator a signal to disconnect you.

On a MAGNETO TELEPHONE (one where you signal the operator by turning a crank) when you are through with a connection hang up the receiver and give one short turn with the crank.

When your telephone is not in use, always keep the receiver on the hook; otherwise your line will be out of order.

Answer your calls promptly. Failure to do so keeps the calling party waiting and may result in the loss of a message.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS APPLYING TO TELEPHONE SERVICE

Scope—The rules and regulations specified herein apply to telephone service and to any equipment and facilities associated therewith furnished by the Telephone Company, and are in addition to the rules and regulations contained in the General Exchange Tariff or in the Local Exchange Tariffs.

Allowance for Failure of Service—The Telephone Company does not guarantee uninterrupted working of its lines or equipment. In case service is interrupted otherwise than by the negligence or willful act of the subscriber, an adjustment will, upon application by a subscriber, be made in the amount of the charges for such of the service, equipment, and facilities furnished as are rendered useless or inoperative. Any adjustment shall apply only to the period the interruption continues beyond twenty-four (24) hours after notice of the interruption is received by the Telephone Company. No other liability shall in any case attach to the Telephone Company.

Care of Equipment—The telephone equipment, apparatus, and lines furnished shall be carefully used and cared for by the subscriber and shall be surrendered to the Telephone Company upon termination of the subscriber's right of use in as good condition as when received, ordinary wear and tear alone excepted.

All ordinary expense of maintenance and repair, unless otherwise specified in the Telephone Company's tariffs or in the contract for the use of the equipment, will be borne by the Telephone

Company. In case of damage to or destruction of any of the said equipment, due to negligence of the subscriber, the subscriber shall pay either the cost of replacing the equipment or the cost of restoring the equipment to its original condition.

Change of Telephone Numbers—The Telephone Company does not undertake to continue the furnishing of service to a subscriber in any exchange area through any particular central office in that area and may change the telephone number or the central office designation whenever it deems it desirable in the conduct of its business.

Connection of Unauthorized Equipment and Appliances—Subscribers shall not use or permit to be used in connection with the equipment or facilities furnished by the Telephone Company any electrical or mechanical apparatus or device not provided by the Telephone Company or permit the attachment of advertising or other devices. Telephone instruments have been designed to produce the best results and are necessarily sensitive and intricate. The use of any apparatus or device in connection with such instruments or the attachment of any apparatus or device to such instruments generally interferes with telephone service. In order to protect the service, the Telephone Company reserves the right to remove from the instruments or facilities any equipment, apparatus, or device of any kind in any way connected therewith other than that furnished by it.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS APPLYING TO TELEPHONE SERVICE—Continued

Defacement of Premises—No liability shall attach to the Telephone Company by reason of any defacement or damage to the subscriber's premises resulting from placing the Company's instruments, apparatus, and associated wiring on such premises, or by the removal thereof when such defacement or damage is not the result of negligence on the part of the Company or its employees.

Default of Payment or Other Violation of Regulations—Charges for exchange service and facilities are due in advance. Charges for toll and long distance service are due when the bill for such service is rendered. All bills are payable at the Telephone Company's business office. Failure to receive a bill does not exempt the subscriber from prompt payment of his account. The subscriber is held responsible for all charges for exchange service and facilities furnished at his request and for all toll and long distance service furnished at his station or stations, including charges for toll messages received at his station or stations on which the charges have been reversed. In the event of default of payment of any sum due for either exchange or toll service or both, the use of foul or profane language, the impersonation of any other person with fraudulent intent, listening in on party line conversations, or any other violation of the Telephone Company's regulations, the Telephone Company may either suspend service or terminate the service without suspension.

Errors in Directory Listings—The Telephone Company issues directories to assist in furnishing prompt and efficient service and it does not guarantee to its subscribers correct listings therein. Every precaution is taken to prevent errors in, and omissions of directory listings but they may occur and the Telephone Company will assume no liability for damages caused to a subscriber because of such errors or omissions. Likewise the Telephone Company will not be a party to controversies arising between subscribers or others as a result of listings published in its directories.

Moves of Telephone Equipment—Telephone equipment installed on the premises of subscribers shall not be moved from one location to another except by a representative of the Telephone Company. For any changes in location of telephone equipment, or wiring, the subscriber shall be required to pay the established charges for making such change in location.

Outgoing and Incoming Service Privileges—The tariffs and rate schedules of the Company govern and fix the outgoing service of a subscriber and in no manner guarantee to him the same incoming service. All incoming service of a subscriber depends upon and is limited by the right of a calling subscriber to such service.

Ownership of Directories—Telephone directories furnished subscribers are and remain the property of the Telephone Company and shall be surrendered upon deliverance of each later issue. No binder, holder, or auxiliary cover, except such as may be supplied by the Telephone Company, shall be used in connection with any directory furnished by the Telephone Company.

Party Line Service—In connection with the furnishing of party line service, it is contemplated that each subscriber will so use the service as not to interfere with an equitable proportionate use of the service by other subscribers on the same line. In the interest of the service to all parties on a party line, the Telephone Company reserves the right to discontinue the party line service of a party line subscriber when the duration or number of local messages sent or received by him is so great as to prevent an equitable proportionate use of the service by other subscribers on the line.

Right of Access to Premises—For the purpose of inspecting, repairing, or removing any part of the Telephone Company's equipment, apparatus and lines, the Company's employees shall, upon producing proper identification, have the right of access to subscribers' premises at any reasonable hour.

Transmission of Messages—The function of the Telephone Company is to furnish means of communication between telephone stations. Acceptance, by employees, of written or verbal communications from the public, for transmission or delivery, is forbidden.

Use of Equipment and Service by Subscriber—Telephone equipment and service is furnished to subscribers for use only by the subscriber, his family, guests or persons residing with him as members of his household, persons leasing or subleasing his residence during his temporary absence from such premises, or by his employees or representatives when engaged in business, except as the use is extended to others under the established regulations governing semi-public telephone service, and private branch exchange service at hotels, apartment houses, clubs and hospitals and except as the use of the service may be extended to joint users under the established regulations governing joint user service.

OUT OF TOWN CALLS

When you wish to make an "Out-of-town" call, ask the operator for "Long Distance." When "Long Distance" answers, give her the name of the town you are calling, the telephone number desired, or if you do not know it, give the name and address of the party you are calling, and then your own telephone number.

Your call can be handled more promptly if you can give the telephone number of the "Out-of-town" party. You can very often obtain the "Out-of-town" number from the Information operator. Simply call "Information" and ask her for the number desired at the "Out-of-town" point.

If the distant town can be reached immediately, the Long Distance operator will ask you to hold the line. When a call can not be completed while you are holding the line, she will inform you of the cause of the delay.

Different rates apply for the different classes of long distance calls. Information regarding the various classes and how each class can be used to the best advantage follows:

A Station-to-Station Call should be made when you will talk to anyone answering the telephone called, or when you feel that the person with whom you wish to talk, can be promptly summoned to the telephone by the person answering. An example of the proper way to place a station-to-station call is, to say to the operator, "I want to talk to Redmond, Iowa, anyone at John Smith's telephone." (Give the telephone number, if known, or the street address.)

Rates are lowest on this class of calls.

Evening Rates apply only on station-to-station calls from 7:00 to 8:30 P. M. during which time the charges are materially reduced from the day station-to-station rate.

Night Rates are in effect only on station-to-station calls from 8:30 P. M. to 4:30 A. M. during which time the charges are materially reduced from the

day station-to-station rate.

Reduced Evening and Night Rates apply only on station-to-station calls where the day rate is 40c or more.

A Person-to-Person Call should be made when you wish to talk with a specified person. An example of the proper way to place a person-to-person call is, to say to the operator, "I want to talk to Redmond, Iowa, Mr. John Smith." (Give telephone number if known, or the street address.) The rate for this class of service is somewhat higher than for station-to-station calls. It requires more operator's time and a greater use of the long distance lines and equipment to locate a specified person and summon him to the telephone.

When it is necessary to send a messenger to summon the person called to a telephone, the cost of such messenger service is added to the person-to-person rate which applies to the call.

Reduced Evening and Night Rates are not applicable on person-to-person calls.

Reversal of Charges—Subject to acceptance at the called station any message charge may be billed to the called station rather than the calling station. The charge on a reversed call is the same as if the call were paid where placed except for a station-to-station call where the initial period rate is 20c or less.

Report Charge—A report charge is made on uncompleted person-to-person and messenger calls when failure to establish the connection is due to no fault of the telephone company. A report charge is also made on reversed station-to-station calls when the party answering at the called telephone refuses to accept the charge and as a result the call is not completed.

To Obtain Rates to any place, call "Long Distance." If you want to know the charges on a call at the close of your conversation, notify the long distance operator when you place the call.

ILLUSTRATION OF CHARGES FOR VARIOUS CLASSES OF CALLS

The following table furnishes an example of the difference in rates for the various classes of long distance service. (Unless otherwise indicated, these rates are for a three-minute conversation. Additional minutes are charged for proportionately.)
