Telephone Service Calls

For numbers not listed, call..... "Information"
For assistance in calling, call..... "Chief Operator"
To report a telephone out of order, call..... "Repair Service"
For business transactions with the Company, call.... "Manager's Office"

Use of the Telephone

Obtain the correct telephone number from the directory before making a call. If it is not listed call "Information."

Speak slowly, clearly and directly into the telephone, with your lips close to the mouthpiece.

Answer your calls promptly. Failure to do so may result in the loss of a message. Giving your name or the name of your

firm when answering, identifies you and saves time.

When your conversation is completed hang up the receiver and, if at a magneto telephone, give one short turn of the crank. This gives the operator the disconnect signal.

Keep the receiver on the hook when the telephone is not in use or your line will be out of order.

Long Distance Service

TO MAKE A LONG DISTANCE CALL, ask for "Long Distance." Give the operator the name of the town you are calling, the telephone number if known, or the name and address of the residence or business firm being called, followed by your own telephone number. If you wish to talk to a specified person, also give the name of that person.

A STATION-TO-STATION CALL is one on which you will talk with anyone available at the called telephone. Charges for these calls are based on an initial period of three minutes, except to points for which the rate is 25 cents or less, where the initial period is five minutes. Station-to-Station calls cost less than Person-to-Person calls, described below, because less operator labor and less use of long distance facilities are required to complete them.

A PERSON-TO-PERSON CALL is one on which you specify a designated person, or an extension or department off a private branch exchange switchboard, to be reached at the called place. Charges are based on an initial period of three minutes. If the party cannot be reached directly by telephone the operator, at your request, will arrange to send a messenger to summon the called person to a telephone. This will involve a small additional charge to defray the expense of the messenger. Also, at your request, the

operator, at no additional charge, will make an appointment with the called party so that you can talk at a specified time.

SPECIAL RATES for both Station-to-Station and Person-to-Person calls are in effect every night from 7 P. M. to 4:30 A. M. and all day Sunday. These rates are lower than corresponding weekday rates on calls for distances of about 50 miles or more. The minimum reduced rate is 35 cents for Station-to-Station calls and 50 cents for Person-to-Person calls.

REVERSAL OF CHARGES is permitted on both Person-to-Person and Station-to-Station calls without extra cost except on Station-to-Station calls of 20 cents or less for the initial period, which take a slightly higher rate when sent collect.

A REPORT CHARGE is made on Person-to-Person calls when failure to establish the connection is beyond the control of the Telephone Company. A Report Charge also is made on reversed Station-to-Station calls when the answering party refuses to accept the charge and, as a result, the call is not completed.

TO OBTAIN SPECIFIC RATE INFORMATION on any of the foregoing services, call "Long Distance." To obtain charges on a call at the close of a conversation, notify the Long Distance operator when you place the call.

THIS COMPANY'S POLICY is to provide adequate, dependable and pleasing service at the least cost to telephone users consistent with fair treatment of employees and of the hundreds of thousands of persons who have savings invested in the business.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS APPLYING TO TELEPHONE SERVICE

Scope

The rules and regulations specified herein apply to telephone service and to any equipment and facilities associated therewith furnished by the Telephone Company, and are in addition to the rules and regulations contained in the General Exchange Tariff or in the Local Exchange Tariffs.

Allowance for Failure of Service

The Telephone Company does not guarantee uninterrupted working of its lines or equipment. In case service is interrupted otherwise than by the negligence or willful act of the subscriber, an adjustment will, upon application by a subscriber, be made in the amount of the charges for such of the service, equipment, and facilities furnished as are rendered useless or inoperative. Any adjustment shall apply only to the period the interruption continues beyond twenty-four (24) hours after notice of the interruption is received by the Telephone Company. No other liability shall in any case attach to the Telephone Company.

Care of Equipment

The telephone equipment, apparatus, and lines furnished shall be carefully used and cared for by the subscriber and shall be surrendered to the Telephone Company upon termination of the subscriber's right of use in as good condition as when received, ordinary wear and tear alone excepted.

All ordinary expense of maintenance and repair, unless otherwise specified in the Telephone Company's tariffs or in the contract for the use of the equipment, will be borne by the Telephone Company. In case of damage to or destruction of any of the said equipment, due to negligence of the subscriber, the subscriber shall pay either the cost of replacing the equipment or the cost of restoring the equipment to its original condition.

Change of Telephone Numbers

The Telephone Company does not undertake to continue the furnishing of service to a subscriber in any exchange area through any particular central office in that area and may change the telephone number of the central office designation whenever it deems it desirable in the conduct of its business.

Connection of Unauthorized Equipment and Appliances

Subscribers shall not use or permit to be used in connection with the equipment or facilities furnished by the Telephone Company any electrical or mechanical apparatus or device not provided by the Telephone Company or permit the attachment of advertising or other devices. In order to protect the service, the Telephone Company reserves the right to remove from the instruments or facilities any equipment, apparatus, or device of any kind in any way connected therewith other than that furnished by it.

Defacement of Premises

No liability shall attach to the Telephone Company by reason of any defacement or damage to the subscriber's premises resulting from placing the Company's instruments, apparatus, and associated wiring on such premises, or by the removal thereof when such defacement or damage is not the result of negligence on the part of the Company or its employees.

Default of Payment or Other Violation of Regulations

Charges for exchange service and facilities are due in advance. Charges for toll and long distance service are due when the bill for such service is rendered. All bills are payable at the Telephone Company's business office. Failure to receive a bill does not exempt the subscriber from prompt payment of his account. The subscriber is held responsible for all charges for exchange service and facilities furnished at his request and for all toll and long distance service furnished at his station or stations, including charges for toll messages received at his station

or stations on which the charges have been reversed. In the event of default of payment of any sum due for either exchange or toll service or both, the use of foul or profane language, the impersonation of any other person with fraudulent intent, listening in on party line conversations, or any other violation of the Telephone Company's regulations, the Telephone Company may either suspend service or terminate the service without suspension.

Errors in Directory Listings

The Telephone Company issues directories to assist in furnishing prompt and efficient service and it does not guarantee to its subscribers correct listings therein. Every precaution is taken to prevent errors in, and omissions of directory listings but they may occur and the Telephone Company will assume no liability for damages caused to a subscriber because of such errors or omissions.

Moves of Telephone Equipment

Telephone equipment installed on the premises of subscribers shall not be moved from one location to another except by a representative of the Telephone Company. For any changes in location of telephone equipment, or wiring, the subscriber shall be required to pay the established charges for making such change in location.

Outgoing and Incoming Service Privileges

The tariffs and rate schedules of the Company govern and fix the outgoing service of a subscriber and in no manner guarantee to him the same incoming service. All incoming service of a subscriber depends upon and is limited by the right of a calling subscriber to such service.

Ownership of Directories

Telephone directories furnished subscribers are and remain the property of the Telephone Company and shall be surrendered upon deliverance of each later issue.

Party Line Service

In connection with the furnishing of party line service, it is contemplated that each subscriber will so use the service as not to interfere with an equitable proportionate use of the service by other subscribers on the same line. In the interest of the service to all parties on a party line, the Telephone Company reserves the right to discontinue the party line service of a party line subscriber when the duration or number of local messages sent or received by him is so great as to prevent an equitable proportionate use of the service by other subscribers on the line.

Right of Access to Premises

For the purpose of inspecting, repairing, or removing any part of the Telephone Company's equipment, apparatus and lines, the Company's employees shall, upon producing proper identification, have the right of access to subscribers' premises at any reasonable hour.

Transmission of Messages

The function of the Telephone Company is to furnish means of communication between telephone stations. Acceptance, by employees, of written or verbal communications from the public, for transmission or delivery, is forbidden.

Use of Equipment and Service by Subscriber

Telephone equipment and service is furnished to subscribers for use only by the subscriber, his family, guests or persons residing with him as members of his household, persons leasing or subleasing his residence during his temporary absence from such premises, or by his employees or representatives when engaged in business, except as the use is extended to others under the established regulations governing semi-public telephone service, and private branch exchange service at hotels, apartment houses, clubs and hospitals and except as the use of the service may be extended to joint users under the established regulations governing joint user service.
