**THE FOURTH OF JULY**  
This is the Fourth of July, the birthday of the greatest republic in history. It is more than that—it is the anniversary of the day, way back in 1776, when government "for the people, by the people and for the people" was born in Independence hall at Philadelphia. It is the anniversary of the birthday of a government founded to protect human liberty, the beacon light of which has encompassed the world and which peoples everywhere are today endeavoring to emulate.

It is at all times a day for rejoicing, marking as it does one of the happiest dates in human history, but today at Pine City it has special joyful significance when we welcome back our Soldiers, Sailors and Marines from their service of patriotism and for humanity.

**"THE BOYS"**  
Pine County today harkens her head and extends her hand to welcome home Her Boys from the camps and the front. It is a half hearted welcome that she holds out to those men who have represented her in the late world-fight for human liberty; it is no expression from a part of her people; there is no sectionalism nor simulation in her position today. She stands, with bared head, to welcome home—Her Boys.

These Soldiers, Sailors and Marines answered their country's call to war when the rights of humanity for which America stands were attacked by a self-seeking and ruthless government. They went in defense of ravished humanity, not seeking war to gratify personal animosities nor national desires. They possibly carried with them some perturbation for what the future might hold but they gave no sign and marched away like true patriots to face privation and death for their own and their country's ideals.

By their acts they have testified their worth and by these standards the people of Pine County have judged and will judge "The Boys."

**THE HOME COMING**  
Wars have been fought before and, at other times, parts of families have been recalled from far lands or the verge of the grave to gladden the hearts of their folk and friends. This day has no epoch making significance but it will remain a memorable one in the lives of Pine County people of day for, in our lives, the great event has been the World War which was won for Democracy.

For months The Boys of Pine County have been coming back from the front and the camps to rejoin their folk and friends at home. Most of them are already here. There have been glad reunions in almost every home represented in the national service and those who have come back have been greeted with community gatherings in their honor in every part of the county.

Today, Pine County as a whole pays its tribute to "The Boys" whom it sent to war. These men went from here as a county unit, representing the county as a whole and not any particular part of it. They gathered at their county seat by ones and twos and threes to register their allegiance to government and right, and later gathered in like manner to go, in their first organized form, to the training camps. Upon those occasions the county bid them "God Speed" with acclamations in their honor.

Today we gather with a gladder theme—to welcome The Boys home again. The purpose is to make the day one that none who are present will ever forget. Everyone hopes it may be remembered with the most gladdest emotions.

**THE ABSENT ONES**  
In the cemeteries at home, or resting somewhere on foreign land, lie the remains of 39 Pine County Boys who laid down their lives in the cause of Their Country and humanity. "They" are not dead. In spirit and in memory of forever they are here today, swelling the chorus of victory. In the great cause of human progress their task has been accomplished, and it is a pleasure to know that they took it up willingly and without a complaint, carried it to the end for the good that it would do. For this Their Country honors them.

Even today, amid the rejoicing of Our Home Coming Celebration, the public mind is not unmindful of those absent ones, nor will it be as years roll round and others go to join them in that "Land of the Lost."

**THE "OLD" SOLDIERS**  
Nearly sixty years ago there was fought in the United States a terrific civil war to decide the question of a united or a divided country. Family ties were torn asunder in this awful struggle and brother fought with brother upon the field of battle.

Finally, the forces for a United Country won the victory, and out of that has grown a more generous understanding and more genuine unity than has ever come to our land before. From Portland to Pensacola and from San Diego to Seattle the watchword over all our land is "One Country, one flag; liberty and justice for all."
