WASHINGTON LETTER.

(From Our Regular Correspondent.)

WASHINGTON, November 11th, 1901.

Senator Mark Hanna, came to Washington on Friday to pay his respects at the White House and to consult with Secretary Cortelyou of the Board of Trustees of the McKinley Monument Association and with the officers of the Memorial Arch Association. With him was John G. Milbourn, at whose house in Buffalo, President McKinley died. Soon after they reached the White House the Cabinet officers arrived for the regular Friday meeting, and during a portion of the meeting Senator Hanna and Mr. Milbourn were present and the monument and Arch questions were freely discussed. Senator Hanna believes that a combination of the two associations should be effected, the monument at Canton erected first and the Memorial Arch later. At a meeting on Saturday between Secretary Hanna and Secretary Cortelyou and Messrs. H. B. McFarland and Thomas P. Walsh, respectively, President and Secretary of the Arch Association, the matter was extensively canvassed. It is doubtful if Senator Hanna will succeed in bringing about a coalition of forces, but both associations will work in entire harmony. It is proposed that the monument at Canton will cost \$750,000 and the arch, to be erected in Washington, \$1,500,000, which latter amount Mr. Hanna regards as somewhat too ambitious.

With the elections out of the way, the political leaders are turning their attention to the important subjects of the tariff and Federal patronage. The President finds a wide diversity of opinion on the former question. It may be confidently asserted that Hon. Senoano E. Dwyer, Chairman of the Ways and Means Committee, and numerous other representatives, and Senators Hanna, Aldrich, Platt and Dewey, all of whom are or have recently been in Washington, consider any change in tariff schedules unwise, and all the reciprocity treaties so far negotiated, impracticable. On the other hand, some of the Western Congressmen are clamoring for the reduction of rates on certain schedules. Some prominent republicans believe a reduction of revenues should be accomplished by a decrease of the internal revenue taxes and still others say that with the expenses that the Congress will have to meet any reduction of revenues will be injudicious. In view of the character of the men who oppose it I consider it safe to predict that there will be no tariff revision by the thirty-seventh Congress.

Rear Admiral Walker has called a meeting of the Isthmian Canal Commission for to-morrow, to complete the report which it expects to deliver to the President, within the next two weeks. Admiral Walker refuses to admit that he has received any formal proposition from M. Hulin, relative to the sale of the canal and Plant of the Panama Canal Company, and he further states that he does not consider the Commission empowered to enter on any negotiations for their purchase, but he has agreed to submit, as a portion of the report of the Commission, the proposition which M. Hulin has formulated.

Notice has been received at the State Department that the French Government proposes to establish in this country a school which shall be devoted to a method of American industrial methods. M. Millerand, the French Minister of Commerce, is the author of the proposed plan, which is a flattering tribute to American enterprise and commercial genius.

M. Margerie, the charge d'affaires of the French Embassy, has had several interviews with Secretary Hay recently and, while I understand that a portion of the time has been taken up with a discussion of the Panama Canal question, it is known he has assured the Secretary that the action of his government in taking possession of certain Turkish ports of entry will in no way interfere with American commerce. The trade of the United States with Turkey is not large, but all goods shipped to the seized ports will be admitted as usual, the only difference being that French officers will collect the regular customs duties instead of Turkish officials.

Public sessions of the Selby Court of Inquiry have come to a close and the evidence is all in the hands of the Admirals composing the court. Their examination will require several weeks and it is doubtful if a decision will be made public before the first of December.

One of Pine City's Oldest Residents Passes Away.

Saturday afternoon, Nov. 9th, 1901, the sad news was circulated that Jacob C. Miller had an epileptic stroke, and that he was fast passing away. The dissolution occurred Sunday morning at just six o'clock.

Mr. Miller was born at Glencove, Long Island, August 31st, 1855, came west in 1879, and on November 23rd, 1881, was married in St. Paul. He came to Pine City, July 27th, 1888, and has remained here ever since.

He was in the hardware business for quite a number of years and sold out to Stieba & Petrick, since which he has been engaged at the tinners' trade, which his health would permit. He was first taken ill at Manly in August, 1899, and has never been well since, although he has not been confined to the house.

On Saturday last he was putting up the coal stove in the sitting room when he fell from the step-ladder, and never spoke but two words afterwards. Mr. Miller was a member of Pookama Lodge, K. of P., and also of Pine City Lodge, A. O. U. W., both of which orders, with the Degree of Honor, of which he was also a member, followed his remains to the cemetery.

The funeral was held on Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock from his late residence, Rev. Peter Knudsen, of Duluth, officiating with interment in Birchwood cemetery. The services at the grave were in charge of the K. of P.'s and the A. O. U. W.

He leaves an aged father, mother, one sister, who all live in Glencove, Long Island, a mother-in-law, a loving wife, four children, three girls and one boy, besides numerous friends and relatives to mourn his loss.

Mr. Miller was an honest, industrious business man, a model husband, a kind father and a faithful friend, and was beloved and respected by all who knew him.

In the death of Mr. Miller the PIONEER loses a close and warm friend, as he was the first subscriber to this paper when it was started in Dec. 1855, and the Village a good, honest business man.

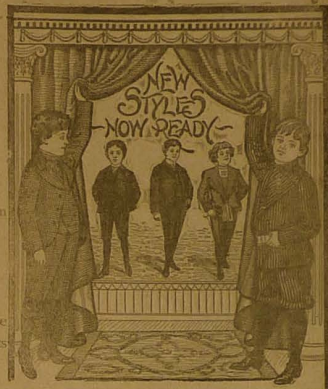

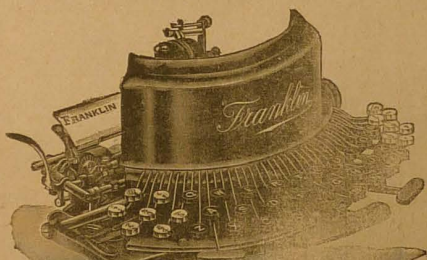
